All the 30 children from this camp are girls and have never been to any school before. We consider this as a significant major intervention by CSSAR. With this new addition, our total number of centre has increased to 4. As on March 2011, the total number of children educated under our various programs is 196.

Another major support to our cause comes through listing of CSSAR by Give India. Give India, as you may be aware is a prestigious donation platform that facilitates choice of support to some 200 grass root NGOs that have been scrutinized for transparency & credibility from their team. This is an encouragement to all of us in the family about time and money going to the right cause.

The number of donors who financially supported us for the year 2010-2011 is 59. We thank you all for the trust and we seek continuous patronage in future. We have also taken a new initiative in terms of sending feedbacks on the donations received from each one of you.

We need every possible support, every possible advice for furthering this cause. And I am certain together we will see more smiling faces round the corner, strengthening the nation of our dreams.

ABOUT CSSAR

Established on March, 11, 2008, the Center for Social Security Action & Research (CSSAR) is a Delhi-based non-governmental, non-political, and not-for-profit organization. CSSAR is an initiative by a group of individuals who have the passion to give back something to the society which has given us so much. It is this passion which drives us.

Vision

CSSAR envisions social security for every individual of the civil society.

Mission

Strengthening urban poor communities, especially the slum dwellers to participate in development process for claiming their rights.

Objectives

- i. Run schools and teach underprivileged children in poor neighbourhoods.
- ii. To conduct research and studies on issues concerning social security.
- iii. To provide training and capacity building to social security stakeholders.
- iv. Promoting self help and empowering the weaker section through formation of self help groups.
- v. Promotion of social insurance and health insurance through self help groups.
- vi. Consultancy services for micro credit, micro insurance, SHG formation, health insurance etc.
- vii. Social security advocacy through seminars, symposiums, workshops and conferences.

EDUCATION PROGRAM

CSSAR has been engaged in teaching of slum children since April 2008. Currently it teaches 196 children in three slums. It has five components:-

Akshar Bodh (Pre-school Education)

The program targets children in the age group of 4-5 years. *Akshar Bodh* is one year of basic preparatory education. The program, apart from motivating parents, prepares children for gaining regular admission in class I in municipal schools of their locality.

Prathmik Shiksha (Primary Education)

This program targets children studying in classes I to V in municipal schools. The program complements gaps in school education and sustains the interest of children and their parents in formal education system.

Anaupcharik Shiksha (Informal Education)

The program targets children in the age group of 11-16 years. The focus is on those who cannot attend formal education because of compulsions to take some employment activity. The program imparts basic education to the level of class III that includes Hindi and Mathematics necessary in day to day life.

Setu Shiksha (Bridge Education)

This program targets children in the age group of 6-10 years who are school drop-outs or those who have never attended schools. The program prepares the children for admission / re-admission in municipal schools in appropriate classes according to their abilities and age. This way, the program further assists them to continue their formal education.

Basic English

The program targets children studying in class VI to VIII in government-run schools. Basic English is taught under this program.
