Survey findings from various credible organisations have found that learning levels and social skills amongst children have dropped at an alarming rate. One has also observed the gender biases with more minor girls being married off because household incomes have dwindled. Similarly, trafficking of children, pulling them out of school to do paid work has increased for both boys and girls.

Amongst all this information and data, we at CSSAR, held our programs and beneficiaries tightly. We continued to work at the micro level, trying as much as we could to engage with the children and ensuring they don't drop out. CSSAR's close knit community of teachers and supporters gathered together to look for funds, contributions in kind and despite all odds kept the morale high. This commitment towards our children is perhaps our biggest strength in CSSAR's continuity and excellence.

Despite of being in this tough time, we are proud to announce that 14 children of our study centres have cleared 10th board exam 2022 and the passing rate is 100%.

I take this opportunity to thank all our donors, well-wishers, supporters, teachers, volunteers, community members and children who are making quality learning possible for all children.

VISION

Vision of the organization is that every child gets proper education irrespective of social and financial background.

MISSION

Provide support to disadvantaged and poor children for their educational mainstreaming and development with special focus at girl children.

ACTIVITY

We have been educating underprivileged children in Delhi, Gurgaon, Faridabad, Sonipat, Bihar & Mughalsarai since April, 2008 and our education program targets children studying in classes 1 to 10 in Govt. schools. Quality of education is not satisfactory in Govt. schools hence this program complements the gaps in school education and sustains the interest of children and their parents in formal education system. Due to this program children are regular in schools and they do not drop out. They understand subjects better and are able to handle class assignments properly. Classes are conducted in slums and villages after school hours i.e., from 2 pm to 7 pm. We conduct remedial classes for those children who live in slums/villages and study in Govt. schools.

GLIMPSES OF CHILDREN'S ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE YEAR 2021-22

- 300 children were educated during the year.
- In total, 14 children have successfully qualified 10th board exam in 2022.
- The percentage of clearing 10th board 2022 is 100%.
- Highest percentage of marks is 69.20%.
- Life skills and community training programs were conducted by professionals from Modi Care Foundation.
- Students' workshop was conducted by SkillTerns which was comprised of a group of students from Modern School, New Delhi.

Her father worked as a rickshaw puller. But due to his medical conditions, he has become bed ridden. Her mother and elder sisters are the real bread earners of the household. Her two elder sisters have been married off and since then their financial condition has worsened. But as it is said that best

of steel is forged through the hottest of fires. All these problems just became a stepping stone for Mahek's success.

She has four elder sisters and one younger brother. Coming from a family with 5 sisters, she was always looked down as another burden on the family. Her elder sisters quit their studies at a young age due to lack of interest. But Mahek is different. She is determined to do something for her family. She wants to provide for her family just like a son would do. She strives for her financial independence.

Mahek had been studying in CSSAR's New Shyam Nagar centre for long. Preparing for her 10th board she studied for 7-8 hours every day. She used to wake up at 6 in the morning and first complete all her household work. Her mother works at apartments to support her education. So, Mahek has to look after her family. Her determination and perseverance finally paid off. **She secured 69.2% in her board exam, 2022.** She topped at CSSAR's New Shyam Nagar center and was awarded a Panasonic digital camera by one of CSSAR's donor. She has taken up arts stream in class 11th. She is still in a growing stage and exploring different domains where she can try her hand. She wishes to combine her passion with her profession and become the one to pull her family out of their misery.



SAVITA: SMALL FEET BIGGER STEPS



Savita Singh has been a student at CSSAR's study centre of New Shyam Nagar slum, Delhi for three years. She is 13 years old and is presently in 8th grade. She enjoys dance and sketching and practices both in her leisure time.

When talking to Savita, she expressed her discomfort in studying during covid. With four siblings and one mobile phone, taking online classes turned out to be a huge hassle

for her.

Due to the immense gap in knowledge because of closed schools, Savita and her siblings were unable to attend all classes. Only sometimes they would get to interact inclass or even attend one. Moreover, the situation at her home seemed highlydiscouraging as her father lost his job due to unemployment. In such tiring times, CSSAR like a rock stood right by its students' side. CSSAR's classes continued during covid and Savita was able to clear as well as learn a lot of concepts that she missed in her online classes. Moreover, the teacher's provided the students with personal attention in the areas that they lacked and the volunteers that came to teach the students helped the students in increasing their area of knowledge as well. Furthermore, the skill training program provided by volunteers helped her and so many kids in increasing their area of forte. She ultimately passed the exams with flying colors and was able to proudly present her final result to her parents.

Savita aspires to fulfill the dreams of her family by becoming a doctor Everysingle day, CSSAR as an organization comes together to help many kids like Savita in achieving their dreams and attaining greater things in life.
