REMEDIAL CLASSES




- We conduct remedial classes for those children who live in slums and study in govt schools in grade 1 to 10.
- Classes are conducted after school hour i.e. from 2 pm to 6 pm.
- Children are taught all subjects at primary level.
- Math, Science, English and Computer are taught at secondary level.
- We conduct baseline, midline and endline surveys to assess the actual learning level of our children.
- So far, we have educated 6,166 children.
- So far 153 children have cleared 10th board exam.

BRIDGE COURSE


- Bridge course is conducted for street children.
- We provide them quality education. In addition, we ensure their nutrition, safety and hygiene through this program.
- We conduct baseline, midline and endline surveys to assess the actual learning level of our children.

Roshni Secured 74.4% in 10th Board 2024

In the city of Delhi, resides Roshni Mathur, a determined girl with big dreams. At 16, she just passed her 10th grade with 74.4%, a huge jump from her earlier scores. Her journey to success wasn't easy, but with the help of the NGO CSSAR, she was able to achieve her dreams.



Roshni's family faced financial struggles, and her parents, Rajesh Kumar and Rama Devi, work hard to provide for their four children. Her father works as a security guard and her mother as a tailor to make ends meet. Despite their efforts, affording tuition fees was a challenge. Then they got to know about CSSAR and decided to send their children to study there. Roshni along with her sister Chandni joined CSSAR in 2022.

Roshni joined CSSAR in 8th grade. Before that, she struggled in school, especially with Science and Math. But CSSAR made learning fun and understandable. Slowly, her grades improved. Science and math, once scary, became her favorite subjects.

Her 74.4% in 10th grade was a testament to her hard work and CSSAR's support. Now, Roshni dreams of becoming a teacher. She wants to share her love for learning with others, just like CSSAR did for her.

With her family's support, Roshni is ready for the next chapter—studying commerce in higher secondary. CSSAR not only helped her excel academically but also gave her hope and confidence for the future.

Now Manju Too Goes to School

Manju, an 11-year-old girl from Delhi, has overcome incredible odds to pursue her dreams. Once unaware of education, she now aspires to become a police officer with the help of CSSAR NGO. Manju's life was marked by poverty, neglect, and domestic abuse from her mother. Despite struggling to meet basic needs like food, she never compromised on her studies after getting the opportunity to study at the NGO.



Before discovering CSSAR NGO, Manju spent her days playing barefoot near the local temple, surrounded by unhygienic conditions. Her father, Rajendra, a poor hawker, couldn't provide her with the necessities of life and education seemed like a distant dream. However, everything changed when teachers of the CSSAR NGO, along with its founder, discovered Manju and introduced her to their workshop at the local temple. Manju showed a keen interest from day one and gradually began attending classes in the NGO's classroom.

Within a month, Manju gained basic knowledge and obtained her Aadhaar card with NGO members' help. This enabled her to secure admission to Nagar Nigam Prathamik Vidyalaya, Tagore Garden, a local school in Delhi. Despite her difficult home life and struggles with basic necessities, Manju remains determined to achieve her dreams. Her journey serves as a beacon of hope for many other underprivileged children in Delhi, showing that with the right support and guidance, they too can achieve their dreams. Manju's strength and determination in the face of adversity are an inspiration, and her future is bright with the support of CSSAR NGO.
