Greetings from CSSAR!

Primary school education in India is free and universal. It is the fundamental right of every child in India to go to school, learn and progress. However, access and quality remain a challenge for most children especially those from disadvantaged backgrounds in both urban and rural India.

Nandini's story is not new. Coming from a lower income family, studying in a government school, she struggles daily to continue studying. But there is something different about Nandini's story. She attends the remedial education classes run by CSSAR and recently scored 79% in her 10th Board examinations.

This is just not the story of "one" but of many, more than 6000 children have benefitted from the remedial classes run by CSSAR in various urbans slums of Delhi. Education is not confined to teaching, covering the curriculum and obtaining marks. Education is about creating an enabling environment for children to be curious, joyfully learn, feel safe and grow every day into confident and committed individuals. All this sounds so pretty but difficult to follow. Afterall, the stakeholders are many. Family, community, surroundings, facilities etc. influence a child's education significantly. Working in urban slums where CSSAR runs its classes, our people through counselling, advocacy and by providing support encourage children and the stakeholders to keep learning.

CSSAR's holistic approach towards learning is the key to the success of its children. We value that our work has been recognised by our patrons, donors and well-wishers. This year we have had interns and volunteers helping us from prestigious universities and institutions - SVKM's, NMIMS Indore, IIM Rohtak, Kirori Mal College, Delhi University. We are delighted that due to the generous contributions from our donors we are providing benches for the children to sit in the classes.

Our steps are sometimes small but our impact is far reaching, profound and sustainable. We thank our supporters and board members for being thoughtful and actively participating in CSSAR endeavours to ensure every child is learning well.

### **VISION**

Vision of the organization is that every child gets proper education irrespective of social and financial background.

#### **MISSION**

Provide support to disadvantaged and poor children for their educational mainstreaming and development with special focus at girl children.

## **ACTIVITY**

We have been educating underprivileged children in Delhi, Gurgaon, Faridabad, Sonipat, Bihar & Mughalsarai since April, 2008 and our education program targets children studying in classes 1 to 10 in Govt. schools. Quality of education is not satisfactory in Govt. schools hence this program complements the gaps in school education and sustains the interest of children and their parents in formal education system. Due to this program children are regular in schools and they do not drop out. They understand subjects better and are able to handle class assignments properly. Classes are conducted in slums and villages after school hours i.e., from 2 pm to 7 pm. We conduct remedial classes for those children who live in slums/villages and study in Govt. schools.

# GLIMPSES OF CHILDREN'S ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE YEAR 2022-23

- So far, we have educated 6066 children.
- In total, 8 children have cleared the 10th board exam 2023.
- The highest percentage of marks in 10th board exam 2023 is 79%.
- Summer volunteers were provided by SVKM's NMIMS Indore for teaching and writing
  case studies at CSSAR.
- Students from IIM Rohtak successfully served their two-months long summer internship program at CSSAR.
- Career counselling programs were conducted by the volunteers of "Project Sahara" initiative of Girl Up Disha from Kirori Mal College.
- For the first time in the history of CSSAR, we have managed to provide little comfort to our children. With our sincere donors' support, now we have benches for our children to sit properly. On earlier days, our children used to sit on dari.
- During 2022-23 a total of 150 children were educated.

# **Program Overview:**

At present, CSSAR is working with the school-going underprivileged children who live in the urban slums in Delhi NCR to provide them quality education. The children are studying in local Govt. schools from classes 1-10. There is one study centre for the primary level i.e., classes 1-5 and one is for the secondary level, i.e., classes 6-10 at CSSAR. Each centre has been allotted a qualified teacher. Classes are conducted after school hours i.e., 2-7 PM. Children are taught all subjects at primary level and Math, Science, English, Computer are taught at secondary level. We conduct baseline, midline and endline surveys to assess the actual learning level of our children. Apart from formal studies, children are encouraged to involve in extra-curricular activities. Besides teaching, teachers play an important role to enhance the self-confidence and self-esteem of our children.



Sanu grew up in a nuclear family in Raghubir Nagar, New Delhi. His father, Mr. Chittaranjan Das, is a factory worker. The family is originally from Cooch Behar, West Bengal. They moved 25 years ago in search of better opportunities and have lived here ever since. While the family is facing difficulties at the financial front, his parents do not wish to compromise with his studies and want him to work hard and excel in future.



He started taking remedial classes at CSSAR's Raghubir Nagar centre since 2011 and always dreams of rising up in life. And that conviction is visible in the way he envisions his life ahead. He wishes to be an engineer when he grows up. He says that he likes to create things. He further elaborates on it and tells us how he has repaired small electrical and electronic gadgets at home with the help of his tool kit.

Sanu scored 82% in 10th board exam, 2020 and got admitted in Govt. Boys Sr. Secondary School, Rajouri Garden in science stream. Not only he excelled in 10th board result but he also got the highest mark in Math in his school. And 2021 welcomes him with wide arm, as he gets the chance to pursue his dream of engineering. He gets admitted in the ACMT College, Uttam Nagar Campus for the course of diploma engineering in Computer Science. Sanu scored 79% in his 12th board exam, 2022 and got admitted in BCA course in IGNOU apart from his regular diploma engineering course. In the same year, CSSAR hired him as an intern to teach Math, Science, English & Computer at its study centre for secondary classes. Sanu is a model of inspiration for youths who aspire to dream high and shine bright.









