Dear Readers...

I am very happy to present this new issue of Newsletter. Even though the country is free from COVID-19 pandemic & lockdown, the shadow it casted on the economy and its impact is still palpable. MANUVIKASA has always been supportive towards developmental aspects of society by reaching out to the grass root of the communities.

While writing this editorial, I am happy to share that MANUVIKASA has rejuvenated more than 180 large lakes, benefiting 18000 farmers of Uttara Kannada, Haveri, Dharwad and Shivamogga districts. MANUVIKASA in collaboration with HSS, a German organization, has organized a historical event in a small village, Karjagi where MANUVIKASA has started in 2003. Learning centre on water and environment has been setup in the Karjagi village of Siddapur Taluk. The learning centre was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Speaker of the Karnataka State Legislative Assembly, Shri. Vishweshwara Hegde Kageri. During the programme an approach paper on Integrated Watershed Management was released.

In association with Edel Give Foundation, MANUVIKASA has organised 'women conventions at Haliyal, Mundgod and Karwar of Uttara Kannada Districts. More than 1500 SHG members participated and exchanged their knowledge and experiences. This newsletter gives highlights on these conventions.

In collaboration with Azim Premji Foundation, a lake convention was held at Sirsi in Uttara Kannada district and Kalaghatagi in Dharwad district, to discuss the importance of lakes and their economic viability. Shri. Shivarama Hebbar, Minister of Labour, Government of Karnataka and incharge Minister, Uttara Kannada District, Shri. C. M. Nimbannavar - Legislative member of the Kalaghatagi constituency and many other dignitaries were present at the event.

The event is a testament to the exchange of



information on the rejuvenation of new lakes in the coming days with details of the farmers benefitting from the rejuvenation of the lakes. The details are provided in the newsletter.

MANUVIKASA which reached the people in the remote places during the wave of the COVID-19 has now launched a free vehicle campaign in all the taluks of Uttara Kannada district, in association with the Azim Premji Foundation. We have appointed 7 Community Health Officers and health volunteers at the field level in 05 selected blocks of the Uttara Kannada District. We have helped 35000 members to get vaccination who are slightly hesitant to take the vaccination.

MANUVIKASA, which already has a number of women development initiatives in partnership with the Edel Give Foundation, has expanded its focus on women entrepreneurship development in the current quarter, including a number of career development and skill building activities such as training on tailoring, catering, beautician, dairy farming and sustainable agriculture development. This issue will give glance on the activities of women empowerment programme conducted by the organization.

In collaboration with the Hanns Seidel Foundation India (HSF) of Germany, MANUVIKASA organized integrated water resource management training to discuss the impact of climate change and crops on farming communities.

We are happy to share that HDFC Parivarthan, a CSR of HDFC Bank has recognized our organization & provided grants to develop livelihood of 1000 households in Yallapur Block of Uttara Kannada and 1000 fisher households in Kundapur block of Udupi Districts through entrepreneurship, skill development, value chain management and promotion of producer

organization.

Pragatimitra Souharda Sahakaari Niyamita and Pragatimitra Farmers Producer Company, subsidiaries of MANUVIKASA, have achieved several milestones in the current year. In addition to championing the prestigious 'Krishi alert' award, many farmers friendly operations such as coconut trading, raw and dry starch, processing and trading of farmers produces and high-quality grocery stores have been launched. I would like to congratulate them on this achievement.

In collaboration with the Foundation for Ecological Security (FES), MANUVIKASA has started a new project to identify and map community assets in Uttara Kannada district.

MANUVIKASA has also collaborated with Give India and Azim Premji Foundation and constructed several farm ponds to help farmers to overcome water shortage. In collaboration with Give India, the organization has also distributed essential groceries for orphans, destitute and other poor families.

Our newly promoted FPOs 'Gokarna Tarakari Belegarara Raita Utpadaka Sangha' and the

'Uttara Kannada Zilla Mahila Meenu Maratagarara Hagu Utpadakara Sangha', collective business activities, have also initiated and successfully implemented for profit business such as selling vegetables, seeds and organic fertilizers, as well as undertaking several more business activities.

Dr. R. Vasudeva, Professor at College of forestry, Sirsi who has written an approach paper on Integrated Watershed Management, said, "According to the study of Delhi Water

Resources Consortium on Water Resources, the current water resources will be drained over the next ten years and that mankind will not be out of danger for a long time. The detailed report is on the basis of the Aghanashini, Bedti and Varada rivers in the Uttara Kannada district".

Speaking at the occasion, Honourable Shri. Shantharam Siddi, Member of the Karnataka State Legislative Council, said, "Developing and leading a socially responsible voluntary organization is a challenging task. It is a testament to the fact that an organization like MANUVIKASA, has come up to this level to accept the challenges and reach the grass root level community,".

In this regard, this learning centre will help the like-minded community to learn more and research deeply on water and

6. Lake convention at Kalaghatagi:

In association with the Azim Premji Foundation, a 'Lake Convention' was organised by MANUVIKASA on 30th October 2021, at the Hanneradu Saavira Math Hall, Kalaghatagi Taluk of Dharwad District.

The convention was inaugurated by Shri C. M. Nimbannavar, the Member of the Legislative Assembly of Kalaghatagi constituency, by lighting the lamp. He addressed the gathering by saying a quote "In nature's economy the water is not an entity; it is life" and later he said, "There are several projects costing hundreds of crores of rupees implemented by the Department of Irrigation, Panchayat Raj, etc. but the development is not satisfactory". He further congratulates and acknowledges the support of MANUVIKASA in rejuvenating the lakes and supporting the farmers".

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Rajendra Poddar, Director of WALMI, Dharwad, said, "The government has been saying that the lake can be rejuvenated with the participation of local people. But there is lack of proper implementation". Farmers in all villages should constitute the lake users group and maintain the lakes after rejuvenation. MANUVIKASA would develop the lakes in the villages and this organization unable to maintain the lakes."

Shri. Yallappa Gonnennavar, Tahalsildar, Kalaghatagi Taluk expressed that, "lake rejuvenation is not only for the economic benefit of the community but also for the maintenance of water resources. It is very important to control the "greenhouse effect" at the global level. MANUVIKASA and its endless efforts are highly admirable. With the help of all the stakeholders and despite difficulties MANUVUKASA has achieved their targets paving the way for others".

Mr. Ganapati Bhat, Managing Director, spoke on the program and explained various MANUVIKASA programmes. At the same time, the farmers shared their experience of reviving the lake and what are the major positive changes in their economic development after applying the silt into their cultivational land.

More than 200 farmers were participated in the lake convention. Cultural events were held by artists of various art forums in the convention.

MANUVIKASA and Lake Rejuvenation:

In the current world scenario, per capita water resource availability has dwindled rapidly during the last few decades. A rapidly decreasing groundwater level is posing a huge challenge for development. Rainfall is the major source for ground water recharge, which is supplemented by other sources such as recharge from canals, irrigated fields and surface water bodies like reservoirs, tanks and ponds. Rejuvenating the reservoir or lake is a promising strategy to arrest the decline of the water table. In view of rapidly depleting ground water resources, MANUVIKASA has been involved in the construction and rejuvenation of different rain water harvesting structures in four districts viz., Uttara Kannada, Shivamogga, Dharwad and Haveri.

Lakes have been rejuvenated considering all engineering aspects such as proper mapping, ensuring saucer shaped lake structure, maintaining the required depth of the lakes by optimum desilting, creating strong embankments, letting appropriate outlet for excess water to flow. Adopting a participatory approach, stakeholders have been involved in planning, execution and post-rejuvenation of lake initiatives. Ecologically, it is noticed that water storing capacity of the lake has increased by 70% after post-rejuvenation. So far MANUVIKASA has rejuvenated 180 lakes.

Sustainable Agriculture Training Programme:

A sustainable agriculture is one which depletes neither the people nor the land: M.D Naik

On 24th February 2022, MANUVIKASA organized a sustainable agriculture training programme at Honnebail village of Ankola Taluk.

The welcome speech was accomplished by Mr. Mahesh Naik, introductory speech by Mr. Ramesh Naik. Programme was driven by watering the arecanut plant.

The resource person M. D. Naik addressed the programme and said "MANUVIKASA done several environmental friendly works. It is our duty to support that organization. Soil conservation and soil fertility will increase by the usage of green leaf manure and organic fertilizers. The soil will turn completely into organic by step by step decrease of usage of chemical fertilisers. Forest development is possible by throwing the seeds in forest. A sustainable agriculture is one which depletes neither the people nor the land. When dairy farming & poultry farming were undertaken with crops management the profit will increase in agriculture.

Another resource person G.V. Naik explained about land preparation, correct method of farming, productivity, vermi compost preparation and their management, control of ants, rats. in farming increases the yield. He said Beejamrutha, Jeevamrutha, Panchagavya preparation are the traditional methods and they are highly effective. Nagaraj Gouda (FPO, CEO) gave information about FPO concept, benefits of FPO to farmers, profit for share member, facilities provides to the farmer from FPO. Discussion session held with farmers and farmers got suggestions for their agriculture related problems.

Devu Gunaga; village Member, Chaitra Naik; RSK Basagod, Nagaraj Naik, RSK staff and Nagaraj Gouda, Madhuri Patgar from Manuvikasa were present and 36 farmer members were participated in this programme.

The organization has already provided free vehicle services across Uttara Kannada district to COVID-19 vaccine for all communities in remote areas. We have a chance to do something extraordinary, the role of volunteers is essential in conducting house-to-house survey and mobilizing the community to build a COVID free society."

During the workshop, reasons behind peoples hesitation in forming voluntary groups for COVID vaccination, superstitions regarding the vaccine and lack of success in the COVID vaccination drive in the district were discussed.

More than 30 volunteers attended the training cum workshop. MANUVIKASA staff Mr. Pavan Bommanahalli, Mr. Shrikant Hegde, Mr. Mahesh Naik and Miss. Sunita Farnandes were present in the workshop.



Distribution of Essential Groceries and Food Kits by MANUVIKASA:

In association with Give India, MANUVIKASA has distributed free food kits to poor, needy and disabled people in various villages in Sirsi, Siddapur taluks of Uttara Kannada district, as well as Hanagal Taluk of Haveri District.

The kit includes toordal, chilli powder, salt, turmeric powder, jaggery, sugar, millet flour, peanuts, toothpaste, soap, sanitizer, oil, toothpaste, rava, sambar powder, glucose biscuit and milk powder. It has helped more than 200 poor families to sustain their daily needs who badly affected by COVID-19 pandemic waves.

Support to Primary Health Centres for Vaccination Drive; MANUVIKASA Provided Vehicles and Covered about 35000 People:

MANUVIKASA, in association with Azim Premji Foundation, has launched a free vehicle system for the COVID-19 vaccination campaign in Sirsi, Siddapur, Yallapur, Haliyal, Joida, and Ankola Taluks in Uttara Kannada district. This has benefited disabled people as well as those from inaccessible and other remote areas who have not taken the COVID-19 vaccination yet.

MANUVIKASA recruited community health officers and volunteers at field level for more than 30 primary health centres, in all selected Taluks of the Uttara Kannada district. It also given proper trainings for aware of the coronavirus vaccine and convincing them that it is their responsibility to get vaccinated. The organization aims to reach out over 35000 people within a span of three months. 7 Community Health Officers and more than 75 volunteers are involved in this vaccination drive.



Small Farming Ponds Built by MANUVIKASA: End of water woes for farmers.

In order to ensure adequate use of natural resources and the prosperity of the farming community, MANUVIKASA has partnered with Give India, APPI, Flipkart to set up more than 193 small farm ponds and also 1150 small rain water harvesting pits in Uttara Kannada district.

As a part of this initiative, farmers have been using water sources for their fields, as well as getting sufficient water for drinking. With a size of 30 feet in length x 30 feet width and a depth of 10 feet, the pond provides sufficient water for cultivation. According to studies carried out by MANUVIKASA, a farm pond can be helpful for up to three farmers and results in end of water woes for farmers.

These small farm ponds are the need of farmers to provide water to the crops they grow and also to rely on other sources of water during the summer season.


