This organization has received National Award as best institution as an Organization promoting Inclusive Education to the Children/persons with Disabilities by his Excellency Shri. M. Venkaiah Naidu garu Hon'ble Vice President of India on 03.12.2019 at New Delhi.

Dr. Kiran Bedi, Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor, Puducherry has visited Special School for the Children with Intellectual Disabilities at Yanam, Puducherry on 6th Feb 2020 during her official visit of Yanam. She has observed the activities of the Special School and interacted with Special Needs Children, also she has distributed Teaching Learning Materials (TLM) and Fruits to all the children of the Centre.

Organized World Disabled Day Celebrations at our Base Centre Premises. Shri Kurasala Kanna Babu, Hon'ble Minister for Agricultural and Cooperation, Government of Andhra Pradesh participated as Chief Guest and Distributed 20 Tricycles / Wheel Chairs, 23 Artificial Limbs and 2 Calipers to needy Persons / Children with Disabilities with the support of Motivation India, Bangalore & GiveIndia Foundation, Mumbai. During this programme Government Officials, Management and Staff of Uma Educational & Technical Society, Beneficiaries and their parents have participated.





North American Telugu Association (NATA), Executive Committee Team Members Dr. Raghava Reddy Ghosala, (President), Sri Alla Rami Reddy, (Secretary), Sri Narayana Reddy Gandra, (Treasurer), Smt. Organized an exposure visit to Tirumala Tirupathi Temple with 50 children with Intellectual disabilities and their parents along with Staff of Uma Educational and Technical Society from 27th to 29th Nov 2019. In this visit we mainly focused on inclusion in the community by created awareness on how to overcome the challenges and for developing confidence by them which is vital and admirable.

It was a remarkable and heartfelt occasion for auspicious occasion of successful completion of 10 Years (One Decade) of Dhirubhai Ambani Early Intervention & Rehabilitation Center for the Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities, Tallarevu. Also it was an occasion to look back over the years of making a development to individuals, communities and society at large. It was a festive time for the beneficiaries as they reflected on the centre past by recollecting the memories of those who have helped to brought into this present shape.







Two Days National Conference on “Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR)” organized with the support of National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Multiple Disabilities (NIEPMD), Chennai on 28th & 29th December 2019 at AKNU M.S.Naicker P.G.Centre, Kakinada. This conference is accredited for “Continuous Rehabilitation Education” (CRE) status by Rehabilitation Council of India. Prof. S. Teki, Registrar, Adikavi Nannaya University, Rajamahendravaram, has attended as Chief Guest, Prof. S. Prasanthi Sree, Special Officer, AKNU M.S.N P.G. Centre, Kakinada, Mr.V. Kamaraju, Assistant Director, Dept., of Differently Abled and Sr. Citizens, East Godavari District, Mr. P. Kamaraj, Faculty of Special Education, NIEPMD, Chennai have participated. This Conference is accredited for CRE status by RCI with 100 seats under Public Private Partnership under non funded Programme.

M/s Multi Commodity Exchange of India Ltd, Mumbai has provided their financial support under CSR for providing suitable Assistive Devices (Aids & Appliances) to Poor and Needy Disabled with an amount of Rs. 1.5 Lakhs. We have invited all our Board Members and conducted this program on 11th Jan 2020.

Bank of Baroda, Kakinada Branches, provided the assistive devices under its CSR initiative on the eve of Republic Day Celebration on 26th Jan 2020. Three Wheelchairs, 15 artificial limbs, 8 callipers and 5 hearing aids were donated to needy and poor PwDs. Sri A.V.Bhaskaran, Chief Manager, Bank of Baroda, Kakinada handed over the assistive devices to the beneficiaries in the presence of the Managers & Staff of all Kakinada BOB Branches.

Training and development describes the formal, ongoing efforts that are made within the organization to improve the performance and self-fulfillment of our employees through a variety of educational methods and programs. We have organized Personality development programme on Values to our staff was conducted by Sri Ramakrishna Surdeo, Trainer in development from 13th-14th July 2019 at our base Centre, Kakinada for 2 days. There are 32 Coordinators and senior staffs have participated.



Throughout the last three decades, Uma Educational & Technical Society, Kakinada has been at the forefront in providing urgent relief materials and aid to the needy during natural calamities, crisis situations, extreme weather conditions etc. Uma Educational & Technical Society is again standing strong during this global healthcare crisis posed due to Coronavirus.

We are providing all necessary help and services to this vulnerable section of the society in the time of crisis at our level best. We are creating awareness on prevention of Coronavirus and distributed 600 Hand Sanitizers, 2000 Masks, 600 Dettol Soaps and 100 pairs washable Hand Glouses to Persons with Disabilities, Old age Peoples and Migrants at Kakinada with the support GiveIndia, Mumbai.

The district-level sports meet for the differently-abled was held on 29th Nov 2019 at District Sports Authorities Grounds, Kakinada organized by Welfare of Differently Abled, Transgender and Senior Citizens, East Godavari. Our Special Schools Children with Intellectual Disabilities at the event participated in long jump, running, throughball and other games and won several prizes.

We have celebrated all the National Festivals, Significant Days, important Birthdays, like Helen Keller, Louise Braille, Mother Theresa, Mahatma Gandhi, etc., World Autism Day, Down Syndrome Day and World Disabled Day celebrated along with the Children with Intellectual Disabilities. Our Special Needs Children also participated in the cultural programmes during Independence Day, Republic Day organized by the Government of Andhra Pradesh.

Department for Welfare of Differently Abled, Transgender & Sr. Citizens, Government of Andhra Pradesh has identified some best institutions in each scheme under this department and deputed officials from the Departments concerned and members of SLMDC to visit the institutions to identify best practice NGOs. Ours is one of the best practice organizations under Deen Dayal Rehabilitation Scheme (DDRS). Sri M.A.Kumar Raja, Deputy Director, Welfare of Differently Abled, Transgender & Sr. Citizens, A.P., Sri V. ## Gharaunda – Group Home for Adults Intellectual Disabled

Group Home for Adults Intellectual Disabled (Gharaunda) is running with 15 BPL beneficiaries with the support of the National Trust, New Delhi. Under this programme, housing and care services are providing throughout the lifetime of a persons with intellectual disabilities, autism, cerebral palsy, and multiple disabilities. We are providing adequate and quality care services with acceptable living standards. This includes provision of basic Medical care, Vocational activities, pre-vocational activities and assistance for further training.

## Deafblind State Centre – Andhra Pradesh:

Deafblind State centre with the support of Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives (APPI), Bangalore through Sense International India is providing services like identification, screening, clinical and functional assessment (vision and hearing) and other various areas like sensory, mobility, communication and functional academics etc. Also providing medical, nutrition and assistive devices, special education and vocational rehabilitation etc., to Deafblind.

- \* Visited and sensitized Anganwadi workers and parents about deafblindness at Gaigolapadu and Sarpavaram on 07.09.2019 and at Nagulapalli panchayat on 28.09.2019.
- \* Conducted NGOs sensitization training on deafblindness on 15th & 16th November 2019 at Ambika Shishu Kendra, Kurnool. 50 special educators have attended the programme.
- \* Conducted sensitization training on deafblindness for Medical and paramedical professionals on 22.11.2019 at Srikakulam. 45 professionals have attended the training.
- \* Formed new Parent Group called CHAITHANYA PARENT ASSOCIATION on 29th February 2020. Mr. S.Ramesh father of a Deafblind child Mr. Dhanush was elected as the president of this association
- \* Good vibes training (Morse code training of Samsung smart phone for deafblind and caregivers) was conducted on 4th & 5th Feb 2020. 15 PwDBs and 16 caregivers have attended the training.





## District Disability Rehabilitation Centre, (DDRC), East & West Godavari Districts

UETS is an implementing agency for DDRC, East & West Godavari Districts of Andhra Pradesh which is under Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Govt. of India, New Delhi. This is under the Districts Management Committee which is headed by District Collector & Magistrate. It is providing several services for the welfare of persons with all categories of Disabilities as per the aims & objectives of DDRC Scheme.

## Community Based Rehabilitation Project for PWDs at Ramapachodavaram:

Community Based Rehabilitation programme is conducting at Ramapachodavaram Mandal, East Godavari District which is a hilly and tribal area with the support of Andheri Hilfe Bonn, Germany. It is mainly focused on Health, Education, Livelihood, Social and Empowerment to persons with different abilities and to create awareness on disability, its causes, prevention, schemes, entitlements, advocacy & lobbying, promotion of VDPOs and empowering the differently abled persons.

### Key Achievements are

- \* 580 PwDs were found through survey & identification in 19 Panchayats.
- \* 62 PwDs were in need of SADAREM Certificates. Arranged to apply online for getting the same.
- \* 10 days training & orientation given to CBR Staff by Rehabilitation professionals of UETS staff and Sri Ramakrishna Surdeo, International trainer.
- \* Orientation on Health facilities available at PHCs / CHCs awareness created to PwDs and their parents. 165 health and anganawadi staff were gained knowledge.
- \* 110 Special Needs children were given Home Based Training by CBR Staff.
- \* 8 Mass Awareness programmes were conducted on Health & Hygiene at Village level.
- \* 20 PwDs were given skill training programme for getting Livelihood opportunity and to support for self-employment.
- \* 162 PwDs were made them to work under MGNREGS.
- \* 348 PwDs are getting Social Security Pension.
- \* 24 VDPOs were formed with 224 PwDs promoted as member.
- \* 39 PwDs could get accessible assistive devices.



## District Disabled Peoples Organization (DDPO).

District Disabled Peoples Organization is under the guidance of Uma Educational and Technical Society, Kakinada with the support of CBR Forum, Bangalore through CARITAS India, New Delhi. The main aim is for Empowering PwDs through Promoting Leadership and Collective Initiatives in East Godavari District, Andhra Pradesh. District Disabled Peoples Organization (Asharaya Zilla Vikalangula Samakya) East Godavari District which is promoted with 372 Village DPOs consisting of 3920 PwDs are under the jurisdiction of DDPO which includes 11 Mandal Level DPOs.

### Key Achievements :

- \* 221 VDPOs are getting financial assistance from the Government of Andhra Pradesh for their development.
- \* Conducted two days two training programmes with 25 DDPO leaders on DDPO manual and 37 DDPO leaders on 2nd level leaderships.
- \* 11456 PwDs could get social security pension under YSR Barosa scheme @ Rs. 3000/- per PwD per month.
- \* For Fund raising and empowering the community people conducted "SRUJANA" musical event.
- \* They conducted PwDs Vivaha Parichaya Vedika for marriages.
- \* 6 DDPO leaders have participated national level convergence meet on UNCRPD at Anathapuram and Chennai.





## Special Education Training Institutes

As a part of developing the human resources, this institute has made special efforts in Human Resource Development in the field of disabilities & rehabilitation. It has been running the following courses which are recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi in association with National Board of Examination in Rehabilitation, NIEPMD, Chennai, AYJNISHD, Mumbai, NIEPVD, Dehradun and Dr. B.R.Ambedkar Open University, Hyderabad.
