Prabhudeva, Mr. Sake Venkatramana, Mrs. Sonali Srivastava, Mr. Lalith Prasad, Mr. Mallikarjuna and Mr. Ganesh, who have been working in the development space at the grass roots, middle and senior management levels of NGOs, Development consultancies, corporate bodies, Training Institutes, Hospitals and Cooperative Banks.

1. ACTIVITIES 2015-16

(i). Monitoring, Evaluation, Learning and Documentation (MELD):

During this year Sree Jnanodaya continued the activities in Monitoring, Evaluation, Learning and Documentation (MELD) for Integrated Watershed Management Project (IWMP) of 7 districts in Belgaum, Bijapur, Bagalkote, Dharwad, Haveri, Gadag and Uttara Kannada of Karnataka state as field support organisation for M/s. The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI), Southern Regional Centre, Bangalore.

Our organisation was engaged in the following activities of MELD;

1. Ensuring deputation of 8 field staff
2. Regular facilitation, field coordination, guidance to field staff
3. Collate monthly watershed visit plan by staff
4. Facilitate and provide inputs (Information, data collection, photos etc.) for reporting as per requirement of the project
5. Review all reports and case studies submitted by field staff
6. Coordinate and Conducted impact study survey, thematic study etc.,
7. Assisted in timely delivery of all outputs of the project
8. Participate in review meetings as and when required
9. Organise and mobilise field visits for TERI officials

Sree Jnanodaya has provided above services successfully in the Third year in the implementation of watershed activities of 2.87 lakh Ha cumulatively, spread across 7 districts in Phase 1 and 2 of IWMP project.



Our staff have been involved in monthly



monitoring and documentation on quality components concerning to people's institutions viz., Watershed Committees, User Groups, Executive Committees and Self Help Groups, Capacity Building activities, watershed awareness programs, skill building and Income Generation Activities of the Sub Watersheds.

We provided field based support in collection of data for the 12 impact studies and four thematic study on Socio economic components of watersheds as contemplated by the project. Honnavar Taluk, In Manki EC, Sampolli village, Shri Mata SHG, discussing with SHG members about IWMP impact and Observing their Records.



We have also collected data for final watershed reports against the baselines v/s Accomplishments on the socio economic concepts, but report writing work is underway. We have actively involved in developing 3 case studies on socio economic componets of the

watershed.

Our team attended 12 review meetings conducted at block and district level watershed offices and 1 workshops organised by TERI. 3,000 Family visits have been made by us during the year for monitoring and documentation on the Income Generation Activities. *The batch 02 MELD outputs of the watersheds attached in the Annexure 01*

(ii). Sustainable Rural Enterprises and Energy (SREE) for women Empowerment in Karnataka:

Our organisation successfully continued its work in the SREE project this year as well, With the support of M/s The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI), Southern Regional Centre, Bangalore for “Sustainable Rural Enterprises and Energy (SREE) for Women Empowerment in Karnataka”. The project has been executed in Koppal (in 9 villages in Kushtagi Taluk) and Bijapur (in 6 Villages across 4 taluks) districts.



The purpose of the project was;

1. Provide skill building training to 900 rural poor women across Koppal and Bijapur districts in Karnataka



2. Disseminate solar lanterns to 600 women in Koppal, as an environment friendly device to enable women to engage in income generation activities during evening hours

3. 50% (400-450 women) of the trained

women to launch a new enterprise or expand an existing enterprise
