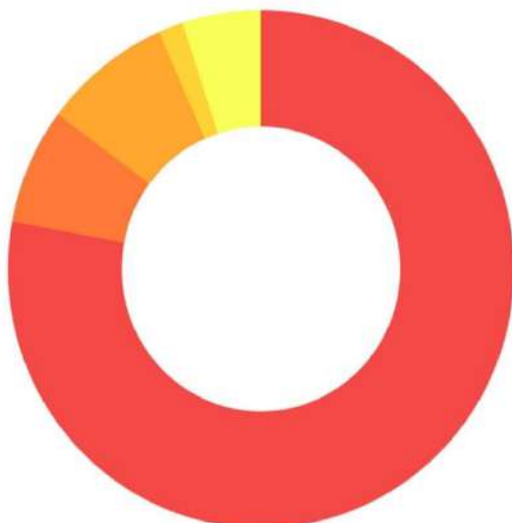

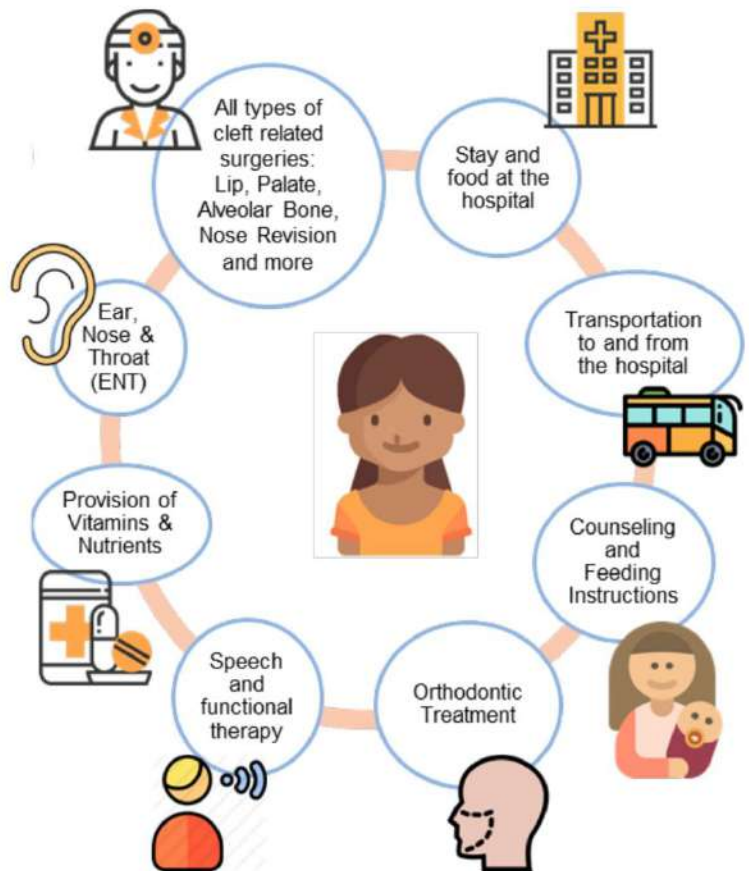

Principle 1

Comprehensive Child Centered Cleft Care

In the centre of our approach stands the child who requires a host of interventions to be able to lead a normal life in a society that fully respects them. For that reason we support all dimensions of comprehensive care to be defined as follows:

ABMSS is the only cleft organization that provides this wide array of services. We are very proud of it. In a medium term perspective, however, we hope to complement the existing offer through psychological assistance. Depending on their experiences of harassment and isolation, cleft children and also their parents suffer extremely under the deformation.



Principle 2

High Quality Medical Treatment

It is our aim to provide excellent cleft care to the less privileged sections of society. Adding to our principle of comprehensiveness, this goal demands a strong emphasis on high quality surgical interventions. We are very happy that our surgeons are highly experienced experts, most of whom having performed more than 1000 cleft surgeries. In order to keep and further enhance a high level in quality, we train junior surgeons through fellowships and support state-of-the-art medical equipment.

Principle 3

Permanent Centres Approach

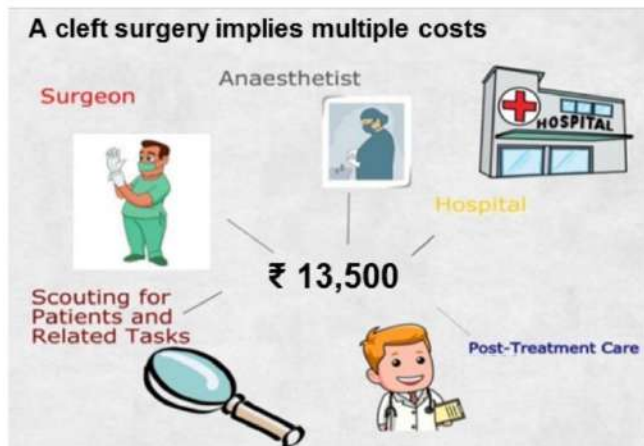
ABMSS believes in the establishment of sustainable local structures in close cooperation with Indian surgeons and medical personnel. In line with this philosophy, it is crucial to work in permanent centres that guide our little patients through their journey that lasts many years. This stands in contrast to the so-called mission approach where medical teams come from developed countries, do as many surgeries as possible in a given period of time and leave the country after that. Ancillary care, speech therapy and not to mention psychological care are mostly not possible in such a setting. ABMSS aims at building a relationship with the children whom we help. We want to be their trusted partner and make a real difference in their lives, not for a week, but until they do not need us anymore.

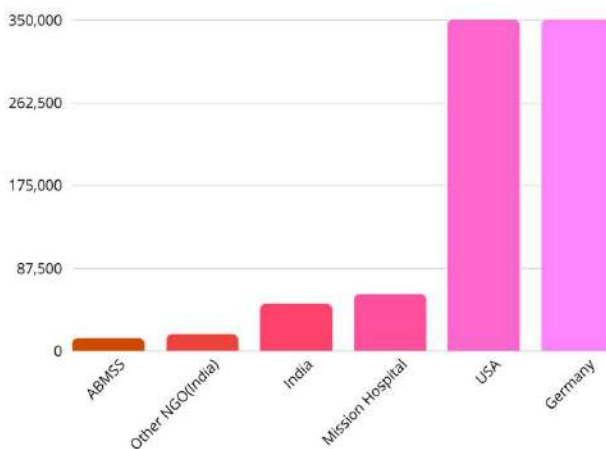

Principle 4

Cost Effectiveness

Cleft Surgeries are very complicated interventions. In order to provide quality care for the concerned children, ABMSS is focused only on this health issue.

A comparison with other operating entities shows how cost-effective we work with our highly qualified team of doctors. A surgery for 13,500 INR is not possible without the immense efforts of our surgeons who really do it from their heart.



SPEECH AND FUNCTIONAL THERAPY

Speech and functional therapy are essential parts of comprehensive cleft care. In the financial year 2016/17, ABMSS supported 1108 speech therapy sessions.

“Even simple and cost-effective exercises drastically enhance the functionality of the muscles and the ability to better speech” says speech and functional therapist Lakshmi Godavarthi who trains speech therapists at ABMSS centres.

AWARENESS PROGRAMME



To maximize the positive impact we have in the lives of cleft children, ABMSS strives to create knowledge and acceptance among the general public. For this reason, ABMSS conducts so-called Cleft Search and Awareness Camps.

One of the most valuable starting points for raising awareness are schools. A cleft child is surrounded by other children and it constitutes an enormous difference for the affected whether their peers come up with teasing or with understanding. In interactive sessions, the students learn about the deformity and meanwhile help identifying patients within their circle of acquaintances who are then admitted to ABMSS cleft centres.

In 2016/17 we were able to commence Cleft Awareness Camps on a much larger scale.

Donors looking for additional or alternative funding opportunities other than surgeries may consider the support of our search and awareness work. Demand is present at any point of time.

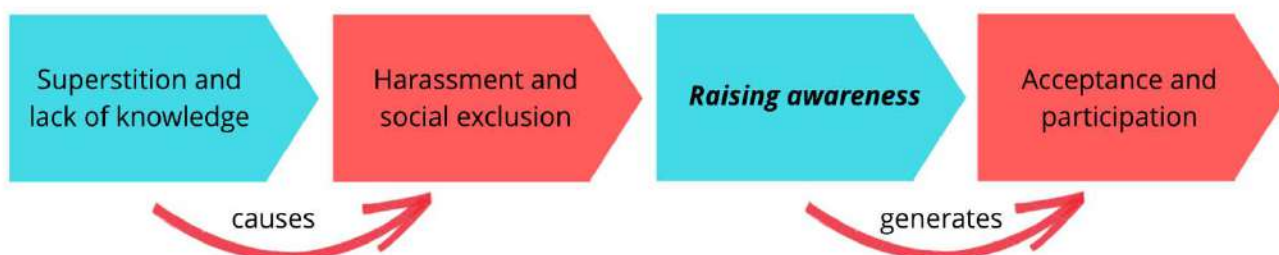

FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME

Within the Fellowship Programme, ABMSS trains young doctors to become cleft surgeons. For this purpose, the fellows work and learn in one of our hospitals for the period of one to two years. In the financial year 2016/17, three fellows were supported by the program.

The learning experience of the fellows comprises a wide range of aspects including both surgical as well as non-surgical skills. The young surgeons are trained in all aspects of cleft surgeries. Furthermore, they are often responsible for the post-surgical care of the patients and the documentation of their treatments. In an multidisciplinary environment, they closely work together with the professionals from other disciplines such as speech therapists, paediatricians and orthodontists. They learn how to conduct cleft search and awareness camps in urban and rural areas. In the camps, one of their responsibilities is to screen the little patients, to diagnose the type of cleft and to provide counseling services to the families of the children.

The Fellowship Programme is a very valuable component of our activities in India. It contributes to the development of the health system by building the urgently required capacities and local expertise in the field of cleft. Furthermore, the fellows do excellent work in our centres and support the cleft teams in multiple areas.

I am very proud that I got to work for an organization that reaches the needy individuals in our society and provides them an excellent treatment.

I wish from my heart that the program will facilitate the training of many more junior surgeons. We serve as multipliers and are the future of the Indian health system.

I would like to thank the Wolfgang-Müller-Osten Stiftung for providing me the platform to better understand the aspects of cleft care, and hone my surgical skills.

STRUCK BY CLEFT - TWICE

Hasina and Saleem; The struggle of a young family with two cleft children

In a small village close to Warangal lives Jakobi (20 years old) together with her husband Jamal and their two children. Both parents are daily wage labors in a nearby cotton field and quarry. Together they earn around 450 rupees a day. The family lives in a small house with just one room in front of which they cook outside using a fireplace. A washroom does not exist - the family fetches water from the well in the village and bathe their children with a bucket.

After Jamal's first wife died, he married his young niece Jakobi, his sister's daughter. The couple was shocked when Jakobi delivered her first baby Saleem. The boy was born with a cleft lip and palate. In the hospital no one took care of the family and they didn't get any information about the treatment of cleft. The parents were worrying very much about the future of their son. Moreover, neither Jakobi nor Jamal went to school and their capability to search for information and help was limited.



The family struggled a lot with feeding the underweight boy. After a year, the family heard about an organization that would help treat their son for free. So finally, Saleem's lip was operated, but: with a poor result.

During that time, Jakobi was pregnant again. They were looking forward to have a healthy second child, but that wish did not come true. Quite the contrary happened: What a traumatic experience it was, when the young woman delivered a still born child. The family suffered from depression for a long time and they were highly thankful for the emotional support of their neighbors and family members.

During her third pregnancy, the family tried to save some money to do a scanning. They got the information that the baby was healthy and without a cleft. But the doctor was wrong and also their little girl, Hasina was born with a cleft lip and palate. The family was very sad and afraid about how to handle their daily life with two cleft children. The parents felt guilty and ashamed that they were not able to have a healthy child. Jakobi thought it was her fault, because she had married her uncle and because of the significant age difference between them.



Added to these emotional hardships, the couple was highly worried about the costs for the treatment of their children. Still, Saleem's palate was open and Hasina would need a long term treatment as well. Just like her older brother, Hasina was also underweight and feeding her was very difficult due to the cleft lip. She was a very weak child and the parents had to bear the cost to treat flu and ear infections. Taking care of Hasina took so much time that Jakobi couldn't go to work anymore and the family income further diminished.

Finally, there was an end to their misfortune. A social worker visited their village and informed our Cleft Center in Hyderabad headed by Dr. Vijay Kumar about the family. The project animator visited the family and saw under what conditions they had to raise their children and how much they struggled to pay for the most essential things like food and clothes.

Hasina's lip and Saleem's palate were operated in Hyderabad and the parents were very happy about the result this time. After the surgery, they received nutrition supplements to counter the malnourishment.

Saleem is now three years old and a very shy boy who just speaks a few words. Due to his palate operation, he is able to eat normally and his speech has already improved. For further improvement he is soon going to start with speech therapy sessions.

Hasina's lip has already begun to heal and in a few weeks the scar will reduce. Her parents are looking forward to have her palate operated in a couple of months.



There are many families like that of Jakobi and Jamal who are unaware about consanguineous marriages, feeding cleft children and knowing where to get free treatment. This is one of the reasons, we initiated the Awareness Program.

SUPPORTED EQUIPMENT

In close cooperation with our supporters the German Embassy, the German Consulate in Bangalore and the Westphal Stiftung, ABMSS was able to supply:

- 3 Anaesthesia Machines for the Cleft Centres Agra, Coorg and Hyderabad
- 2 Endoscopes for the Cleft Centres Agra and Visakhapatnam
- Surgical Instruments for the Cleft Centres Coorg, Mysore and Mangalore.

Cleft lip and cleft palate surgeries are performed under general anaesthesia. Therefore, an anaesthesia machine constitutes an essential building block for each and every cleft surgery. Furthermore, the ventilation of the patient is facilitated by the machine. Excellent equipment is key to a high quality cleft treatment. The modern anaesthesia machines, however, are expensive. Therefore, ABMSS tries to support the centres in this respect.

Apart from the new anaesthesia machines, endoscopes are highly required in our centres. The instrument which is equipped with a camera strongly supports the insertion of the ventilation tube (intubation). While in the past it used to happen that some surgeries could not be performed, the challenge of intubation is not an obstacle anymore today.



100 SMILE DRIVE 2016 - 147 NEW SMILES IN INDIA

For the second time now, the 100 Smile Drive has aimed to raise funds to support 100 cleft surgeries in India. The drive has been very successful in both the years. In 2015, the success of the campaign enabled us to finance 125 free cleft surgeries and in 2016, the number catapulted to 147 free surgeries. Deutsche Cleft Kinderhilfe Stiftung: Help for our severe cases

INTERNSHIP AT ABMSS



What feelings are being triggered in a mother after the birth of a cleft child? What does she know about the deformity? And is the mother-child relationship thereby affected? Maike Herrmann, a psychologist at the University of Leipzig, went to the bottom of these questions. Within the scope of a five-month internship at ABMSS, she interviewed a total of 147 women, 107 of whom were mothers of cleft children. One of the key results of her study was that around 50% of the mothers think they are responsible for the deformity of their child. Only a quarter of the women know that, among other things, also genetics plays a role.
