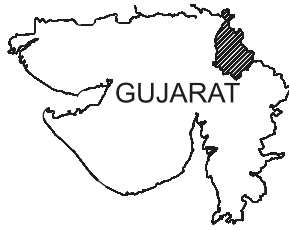

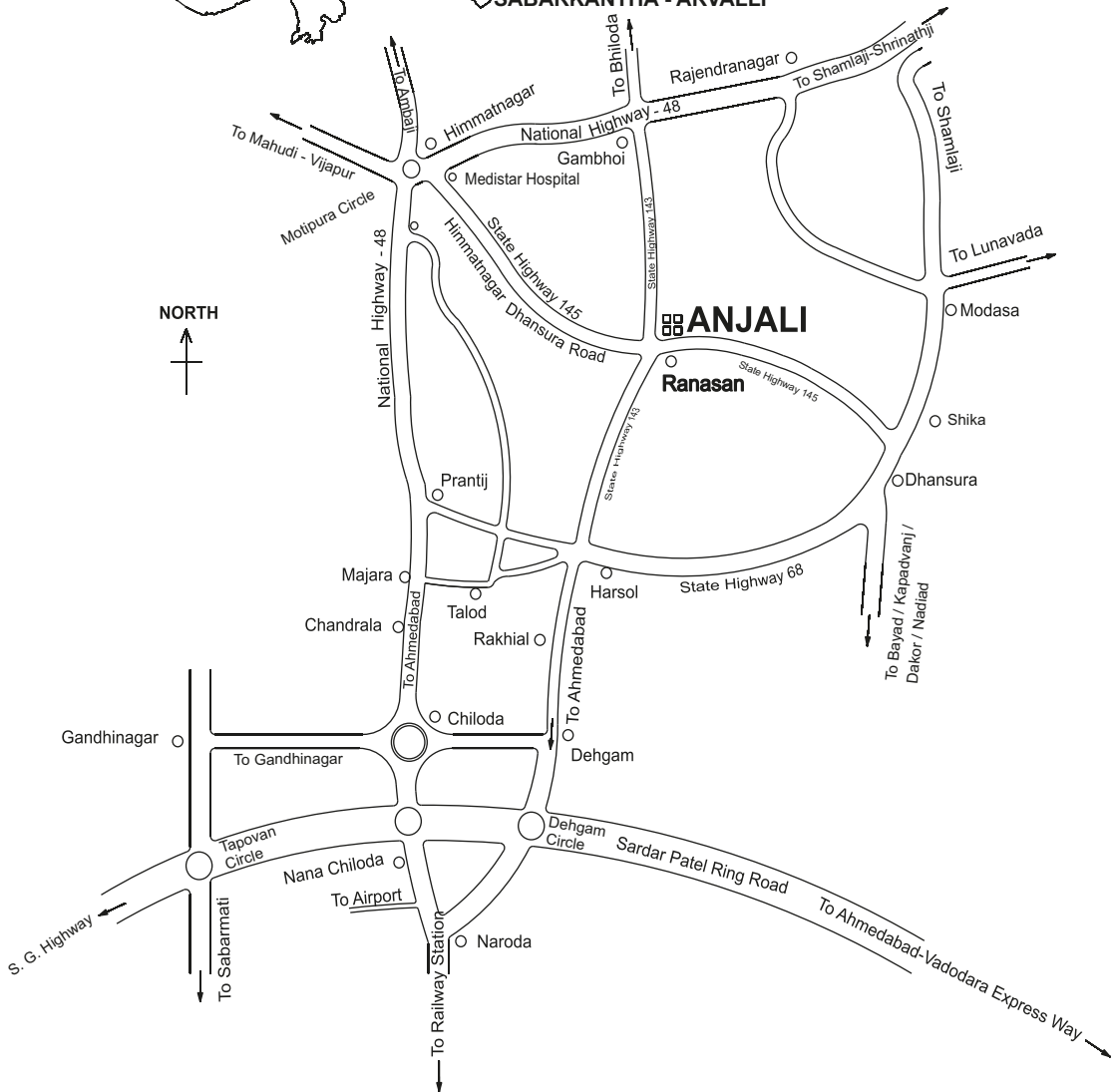

It is my pleasure presenting before you the activity and financial report of Anjali for the year 2019-20. While writing this report Covid-19 has covered the whole world. Most of the countries of the world are facing the pandemic.

Anjali Hospital through its various departments has provided all essential health services to the local community. "Health" is community's fundamental necessity. In health, non-infectious diseases, non-communicable diseases, and lifestyle-related diseases have increased. The medication for these diseases is lifelong. Therefore, if the patients get the treatment and investigation at a concessional rate, they can continue the medication and avoid major health complications. For these kinds of needy patients, Anjali has arranged a subsidy structure from which patients are getting benefited.

We are giving intense and easy to understand health-related information to the saving group women members, which they have started taking very seriously. We felt that if explained positively in simple language, women members are able to understand, accept a scary topic like cancer. Women members have understood that early diagnosis and treatment increases the chances of recovery. Members have started going out on their own and started doing what they like. They have started discussing on women related topics. Yes, the numbers are less but it's getting started.

This year in tree plantation, we concentrated on the maintenance of planted trees and replaced undeveloped trees with new saplings. Many visited the tree plantation located at "Rayan Lake" which encouraged us a lot.

Like other organizations, Anjali is also being hit by the covid-19 pandemic. In March ending, Anjali usually gets more donations but this year, donations have decreased due to the pandemic. Anjali, a non-profit organization that depends on donations may face financial crises in the coming days.

On behalf of Anjali, I thank you for giving us your support, cooperation, guidance, assistance, and warmth. In the coming years also Anjali will need the same support and guidance and we hope that we will receive the same from you.

Anjali was established in the year 1988. The activities of the organization were initiated on 29th January 1989.

The founders after completing higher education founded Anjali in order to use their skills & capabilities for the poor and the needy.

Anjali is a voluntary organization based in village Ranasan. Ranasan with population of 5000 is a village in Talod taluka of Sabarkantha district in north Gujarat in India.

Beginning was made with health activities, the poor and the needy being the target population. The health activities developed progressively and other activities were included as the needs were perceived.

At present the activities of Anjali are, a 50 bed Anjali Hospital, women's program in 50 interior villages (on the platform of saving groups) and environment enrichment program. Organization is inclined towards development programs for children, youth, and villages.

The soil in Ranasan and its vicinity is rocky & sandy and the climate is dry, windy, hot during 7-8 months of the year and cold during the winter months. The rainfall is less and unpredictable. There are two rivers which run if there is ample of rainfall. There are few lakes & other sources of water. The principal vocation of the people is agriculture. There are few industries in the vicinity. The level of education is low. Most of the population is economically & socially weak.

The majority of the population of this area comes from the communities of Thakors, Dalits, Ravals, Vagharis, Banjaras, Vadi, Pagi, Rabarisamaj and migrant adivasi labourers. Most of them earn their livelihood from agriculture or miscellaneous labour. They have not made much progress either economically or socially. These groups of people along with other economically weak & distressed section of the population are the main beneficiaries of Anjali's activities.

In 1993. Anjali Hospital started work with 30 beds. Gradually, it continued to grow. As services increased we added new OPD rooms, wards, medical unit, and department of obstetrics. Anjali Hospital has not remained only a building now it has become a living organization. The growth became possible due to the constant support of the donors and well-wishers, which is like blessings for the beneficiaries of this region. Health work requires financial support. Schemes have been set up for various rooms, wards, etc. of Anjali Hospital to raise financial resources. Mr. Ramsinh Rahewar, a native of Ranasan village, has been our well-wisher from the very beginning. His family provided support periodically. This year he donated significant amount for name of room in which Blood Storage center is located. It was named Smt. Amrutkunwarba Ramsinh Rahevar and Shri Ramsinh Sardarsinh Rahevar". He has set an example for the local community. We thank him on behalf of Anjali.

Nowadays, energy saving is being done in many places with the aim of improving quality of environment and at many places work is underway to generate energy from alternative and renewable sources. Along with health we also thought of doing something in this area. But the cost was very high. As a part of alternative

and renewable energy production we have installed roof top solar energy production at Anjali Hospital with capacity of 37.5 KVA. The government has also come up with a good plan to produce and use solar power. As per new plan, the government takes away the power generated from solar and we get deduction in our electricity bill which is very appreciable. The consumption of electricity in hospital is very high as lights, fans, Air conditioners in OT, ICU, Lab, X-Ray room, Blood storage center and autoclaves, washing machine, elevator plus various instruments and equipment consume significant amount of electricity. As we have good sunlight practically throughout the year the production of solar power is significant. The electricity bill came down in the last six months. The noble person who provided financial support for solar plant has chosen to remain anonymous and has given emphasis on saving for Anjali. Anjali thanks him on behalf of local beneficiaries/ villagers of the area.

Out reach services

Eye camps were organized every week throughout the year.

“Gandhi 150” Celebrations : Anjali celebrated 150th birth year of Gandhiji from 2nd October, 2018 to 2019. As part of celebration, inspirational thoughts of Gandhiji were written daily on a special notice board throughout the year. In evening prayer of every Saturday, reading was done from a book about Gandhiji.

On the topic of “Me & Gandhiji”, staff members tried to connect themselves with Gandhiji and tried to interweave different occasions and shared their thoughts on the subject. A discussion was kept on thoughts/ideas of Gandhiji and Anjali's objectives of social service. A book on life story of Gandhiji's was gifted to staff members and a quiz was organized on life and thoughts of Gandhiji.

Earlier, under this program, we checked the health of primary school children in nine surrounding villages for three months including providing nutritious food to children along with demonstrating recipes with the mothers and Aganwadi workers.

Hinaben Ashokbhai Nayka (name changed) had come with family from small village of Panchmahal District for farming work as labourers. She was 30 years old and had two daughters. She was pregnant. She was having pain so wanted to meet a gynecologist in Modasa. Her landlord/owner asked to finish the work of planting potatoes and castor in the field. Three days later Hinaben started having breathing problem therefore, her husband borrowed some money from the landlord for the treatment and went to see Gynecologist at Modasa. Her hemoglobin was very low. The doctor made a phone call to their landlord and informed that she needs blood and proper treatment. When they went back home, their landlord told them to go to their native place for the treatment. Even though Hinaben was not well, she had no choice but to leave. One of their friends told them to go to Anjali Hospital, a Ricksha driver saw them on the road and on seeing her condition brought her to Anjali Hospital. At Anjali Hospital, when Medical Officer checked her, she was 36-37 weeks pregnant and her hemoglobin was only 5.90 gm. She was given 2 bottles of blood and during the course of treatment went in to labour pains and gave birth to a healthy child. Whole family of four stayed at Anjali for around four days. They received treatment and food free of cost at Anjali Hospital.



Urmilaben Rameshbhai 65 years. She had multiple dried up ulcers in both her legs, could not walk, had dribbling of urine and was in bad mental stage shouting, yelling and telling bad words. She was brought to consult a doctor. After checking doctor found infection in her leg and therefore, she had become very weak. She was found to have diabetes and there were diabetic ulcers. She was put on Insulin and Surgeon operated and cleaned her ulcers under anesthesia and removed lot of pus, she was put on urinary catheter. The wounds were very deep, daily dressing was required, and therefore, she was admitted for a long time. To heal her wound fast, she was given regular medicines, nutritious food like milk, tomato soup, protein powder, protein biscuits, etc. When the wound healed, the surgeon did skin grafting and put a new skin. Initially when Urmilaben came, she couldn't walk but after 60 days intense treatment and care, she was able to walk again her catheter was removed and she could pass urine voluntarily. She was given all the treatment and her surgeries, dressings and stay was totally free. She went home smiling. The staff of the hospital was a bit emotional when she left.

Ranjanben Dashrathji Vanzara. Age-30. She came from very small village of Malpur Taluka of Aravalli District which is tribal area and about 70 Kms away. Her whole body was blistered. She consulted Dermatologist at Anjali Hospital. She was admitted. As part of the treatment, she was given bath with Potassium permanganate water by the staff daily, was given regular medicines, nutritious food like two times milk (more than other patients), tomato soup, sing-chana & jaggery (powerhouse of protein and carbohydrates), and coconut water. She was admitted for 13 days. When she got discharged the blisters on her body were healed and she was very happy and relieved from the pain. She was given 75% waiver from the treatment bill.

- (2) **Women's Activity:** Monthly meetings were held in 30 villages during the year. During the meetings discussed various topics, savings and loan transactions were done. In these meetings of the each saving groups, problems were resolved and understanding was cultivated when there was confusion. Met new women and created new saving groups. Somewhere, at the behest of the members, closed down the saving groups. Stayed connected with the members through monthly meetings during the year.
- Once a year, members of the saving groups come to Anjali for the meeting which is called annual meeting. This time the topic of the annual meeting was cervical cancer and breast cancer in women. Explained causes of cancer, symptoms, how to make an early diagnosis, cancer treatment, and how to prevent the cancer. If diagnosed early, cancer can be completely cured with modern/advanced treatment. Through video, gave insights of “Pap test” which is performed for early diagnosis of Cervical Cancer. For early diagnosis of breast cancer, through video demonstrated how to self-examine the breast regularly. At the same time, gave directive informational pamphlets to the members so that they don't forget and the information would be spread. LED bulbs were given to the women by one of Anjali's well-wishers, Mr. Chandravadanbhai and Ushaben Shah with the intention that the electricity bill of their houses comes down. This was a very good experience. Like every year, this time also we gave vegetable seeds of bottle gourd, green flat beans, bitter gourd, sponge gourd for the kitchen garden. Discussed the accounts of each saving groups. Provided intensive understanding and information where needed. Anjali Hospital has 40 seater bus for eye camps. This year most of the women came by this bus for the meetings. Saving group annual meetings must start and end on time as women need to reach home to milk their cattle in order to deposit the milk to

dairy on time. Everyone enjoyed the bus transportation and they all paid token charge. In total 1221 women members participated in the meetings.

March 8, International Women's Day was celebrated with enthusiasm. The saving group women organized rallies with teachers, students, and health workers in their respective villages. Where we could not attend the rally, they sent photographs via WhatsApp.

Since we have started to bring women together through saving groups, every 3rd or 4th year, we are organizing “Mandal na Sange.... Pragatina Panthe” (Spirit of oneness) event to generate a sense of oneness by bringing them together on stage and to make them feel that they are growing in many ways through the activity of saving groups. On 5th January, 2020, this event was organized. Over the years this was 5th program. 1372 women members of 140 saving groups were in attendance. 150 women members participated in singing, plays, garba (traditional Gujarati dance). 37 local men from different villages, who are taking interest in women's activities, encouraging & helping them, were also invited and they attended the event. The men came on stage and expressed their opinions regarding activities. Men getting invited because of the women must have happened for the first time in these communities. Women members performed very effective plays on the prevailing customs of society which are very harmful, oppressive, and strangles the growth of the women. Very confidently performed motivational and encouraging garba (Gujarati traditional dance) and songs. This time we saw a different type of enthusiasm and excitement. The impact of the play on social issues was great which we discussed in the following monthly meetings. Shri. C. J. Patel, District collector, Sabarkantha was invited in the event. He attended the program and delivered an inspirational speech. Anjali's member and well-wisher Ms. Pranotiben Modi, (Architect) who is learning Kathak dance form at the age of sixty years, performed Kathak dance and inspired all by saying “at any age you can learn whatever you are interested in”.

Adolescents Program :Students of 11 higher secondary schools and 14 primary schools were included in this program. Explained about menstrual cycle, changes that occur during adolescence, cleanliness, importance of proper nutrition and effects of Anemia on studies, career and health. Along with that, had intense discussion regarding safe behavior and addiction. Worked with 677 adolescent girls and 778 adolescent boys. Worked once a month with 7th and 8th standard students of primary school.

Self-defense training was given to girl students of 9th to 12th standard of 10 high schools at Anjali. Two-day training to 455 girl students in batches. It was intense training by qualified trainers. The training was given by various methods to make it interesting as well enable the girls to develop sound understanding.

Dipeshwari Women's saving group is being run in Dadarda Village. Sangitaben Sanjaybhai Nadia is its leader. She is running the saving group very well. Before joining the group, her situation was not that good. She had a lot of skill but due to lack of support she could not grow. Whenever field workers went for the meetings, she used to talk about things she would like to do. After joining the group, she became confident and started going out for her own work. She has started taking part in various activities like going to the bank, attending annual meeting at Anjali, and going for the picnic. She took a loan from the saving group to support her husband's business. They used to sell cutlery on handcart in every village. From the small venture they started generating income from that income paid loan installments. After initial success, they expanded their venture by purchasing a bike, attaching iron lorry to the bike and started selling cutlery on it. Sangitaben felt that for her families' prosperity she has to do something more. She learned stitching and got the stitching machine. She stitches the blouses and as her finishing is good, she is getting business. She has enrolled her children in school and encouraging them to study properly. She even renovated her house by taking loan from the saving group. She wanted to learn driving a bike so her husband taught her. In annual meeting she gave message of doing whatever one wishes to do.



Manguben Chauhan, village Navi Ramos. She is a saving group member. Since beginning she is involved with women's activities. She was diagnosed with cervical cancer. The surgery was also performed. After the surgery doctor advised her to take radio therapy. She got scared and never went to see the doctor again. In annual meeting she got the information that cancer is curable with regular treatment. She had a talk with our worker regarding her situation. Our worker gave her information about the treatment and encouraged her to visit the doctor again in order to resume and complete the treatment. She went to Ahmedabad Civil Hospital for the treatment, took 25 radio therapy sittings. At present, she is very healthy and doing all the household work.

Bhathikhatri village is 15 km away from Ranasan. In this village there is one saving group named Mahila Bachat Mandal with 20 members. Bhikhiben Parmar is one of the members. Regularly she deposits her installments. Until now she has taken a loan of Rs. 2,40,000 which she has already repaid. First she purchased Xerox machine for her husband. Now she has purchased printing and stamping machine. From the income of this shop, she is depositing all the installments. Bhikhiben has also taken loan for the land and to build cattle house. Thus, through one woman, her husband got employment and income. Seeing the progress of this saving group, another saving group called Satyam Mahila Mandal has also started.



(3) **Environment Enrichment Program :**

Tree Plantation begins with lot of pre-planning. Then the ancillary work goes on. This year planted 1450 trees. Replaced some old and dead plants. Protected naturally grown trees with tree guards. Naturally grown trees were Kanaji, Kanajo, Neem, Vikalo, Khijado, Mindhal, Igoru, Ankala, Bavad, Kandhu. In summer days, April-May-June-July, plants were watered regularly. Water was provided by Meena Prints Ltd, for which we are thankful to them.

Forest department's Normal Range Department grows saplings for forest work only. As they are aware of our tree plantation, we got 350 saplings from them free of cost. Ploughed plain areas and planted Karad and Stylo grass seeds. Grass is growing up. Hopefully next year it will grow again in the rain water.

Removed the plant called Congressgrass (Nafattiyu) from the lake by JCB. Dug a trench to prevent seepage from the lake. But due to lack of black soil, we could not complete the work. We will try again.

The villagers also came to visit the site. Regular cow and buffalo herders also take care of the trees and if they see something unusual, they instantly report. Some guests visited tree plantation site. Mr. Kiranbhai Gandhi (U.S.A), Adilbhai Mangarolia (Mumbai) and other well-wishers came and encouraged us.

(4) Staff Welfare :

Celebrated our national festivals 26th January and 15th August by flag hoisting. Celebrated various festivals with special prayers and reading sessions. Anjali turned 31 this year, we celebrated it with prayers, discussion and talk. All the staff went for the picnic to Statue of Unity and Poicha Swaminarayan Temple. All enjoyed boating in Narmada river and some even visited “Kuber Bhandari” temple. National Award winner women centric movie “Hellaro” got released this year. Whole staff went for the movie to Himatnagar by hospital bus. Everyone enjoyed a lot.

In all the organizations its mandatory to form a committee for Sexual Harassment at workplace. Anjali also has formed Sexual Harassment Committee to address and resolve the sexual harassment complaints. We felt that everyone should be aware of what is sexual harassment, what sexual harassment at workplace means, and what are the laws on sexual harassment. So, on this subject we organized one training session with Ms. Nimisha Desai from Vadodara based “Olakh” non-profit organization.

(5) Covid-19 Work :

From 23rd March to 31st May the government had declared lockdown due to Covid-19. During this lockdown Anjali Hospital was open. The work undertaken/done for the awareness and prevention of covid-19 is as follows:

- Performed preliminary check-up of each patients and referred suspected cases to Civil Hospital.
- Gave each patient an understanding of social distance and followed social distance rule in the hospital.
- Informed every patients and relatives about the importance of the mask and distributed free masks to those who had come without mask. Till now we have distributed around 10,000 masks.
- Hand Sanitizers are placed in the hospital. Explained the patients how to use sanitizer and wash the hands with soap properly.
- The staff of Anjali Hospital has been provided the necessary equipment for self-protection.
- Information (as per Govt. guidelines) on covid-19 has been displayed in the Anjali Hospital.
- Gave Ayurvedik Ukalo (Immunity booster drink) to the patients, their relatives, and the staff.

- Anjali Hospital has put up drinking water cooler for general public outside the hospital. To wash hands with soap, Anjali has placed a wash basin with soap besides the water cooler.
- Sanitization was done every 2 days through Anjali Hospital in Ranasan village and adjoining suburbs.
- Distributed 3500 masks in the Ranasan with the help of Meena Prints Pvt. Ltd and Ranasan Gram Panchayat.
- Distributed essential kit of grains and vegetables to 370 families along with Ranasan Gram Panchayat.
- Anjali is located on Himatnagar-Shika state highway. During the lockdown, workers from Panchmahal district were going to their native village by walking. Anjali provided food and arranged a vehicle for them.
- Raised awareness about the corona virus in 50 villages of Sabarkantha and Arvalli districts, among 1700 members of 140 saving groups. The main message was **Sanitization-Mask-Social Distance (SMS)**
- Distributed 3400 masks to 1700 saving group members. Explaining them the importance of wearing a mask, keeping a 6 feet distance, washing hands with soap, and along with these, we are providing information on disease prevention.
- Corona Rakshak Insurance policy was taken for the financial protection of Anjali Staff.
- Distributed the kits of nutritious grains two times to the Anjali Staff.
- Distributed food kit to the needy families of Ranasan village and tribal labourer families of Ranasan, Ranasan Kampa and Madhva kampa.
- Distributed soaps and washable masks to 450 pregnant and lactating women from 21 villages and 30 Anganvadis.

Tribute to Dr. Anilbhai Desai



Dr Anil Desai passed away on 16-04-2019. Anilbhai as we called him, contributed significantly in establishing Anjali, in moulding us, and provided motivation, guidance and strength for doing poor centric social work. Anilbhai was founder trustee of nationally and internationally well-known voluntary organisation “SEWA RURAL”, Jhagadia. Sewa Rural has done pioneering work in the country in the field of Mother and Child care. Through SEWA RURAL he contributed significantly in the field of health (curative, promotive & preventive), economic empowerment of youth and women and education of children.

Anilbhai cared for and was concerned about individual development of workers and made sincere efforts that each employee considers himself part of the social work being done. Through value based social activities and policies, scientific approach, spiritual orientation and development of workers he laid strong foundation of the organisation and did multiple service and development oriented activities.

Two of the founder trustees of Anjali had worked in Sewa Rural for five years. During that period developed clarity about social activities. On deciding to start work in Ranasan, he intensely discussed about our work plans and provided important guidance in planning. In 1987 when we started work at Ranasan we took personal interest free loan from him. His wife Dr Lataben Desai along with him has also contributed significantly and continues to do so. Dr Lataben Desai was one of the founder trustees of Anjali. As an invitee to the trustee meetings he accompanied Dr Lataben in trustees meetings and actively participated in discussions and provided much needed guidance, suggestions and warmth in the initial years. After Dr Lataben could not continue as trustee, both of them kept on visiting Anjali periodically and there were good discussions.

He suffered from various health problems for some years. Along with deep spiritual understanding, he had imbibed spiritual orientation in day today living. Because of which he could accept all health problems and endure all discomforts. He always said “Thy will, be done” and lived it, he used to convey this to us also. His affectionate, sensitive, benevolent and loving nature and smiling face will always be remembered and will keep inspiring us.

Following resolution was passed in Trustees meeting to honour him :

“All the trustees of Anjali paid homage to Dr Anil Desai on his sad demise. From founding days till date, Anilbhai’s contribution to Anjali’s growth has been invaluable. He dedicated his life in being useful to the downtrodden and their development. He was loving, sensitive, frank spoken and a capable strategic planner. Along with Sewa Rural his absence will be deeply felt at Anjali also. We pray lord to grant him eternal peace”

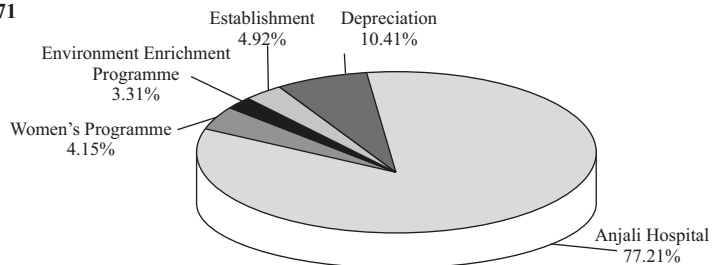

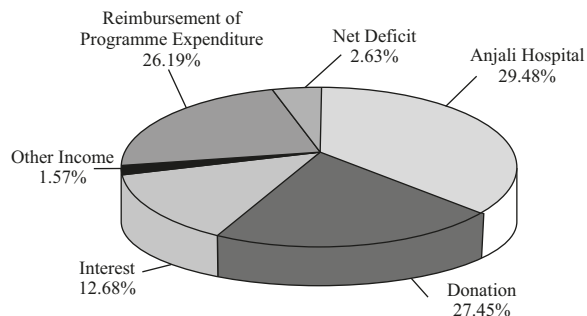
