

Dear Friends and well-wishers,

It is my pleasure presenting the activity and financial report of Anjali for the year 2020-21. Whole year we fought against the covid-19 pandemic and while I am writing this, we are getting prepared for the third wave.

During the year 2020-21 two waves of corona-19 were experienced. In the first, remote villages were not affected by the covid-19 but in the second wave, villages got severely affected by the covid-19. Anjali Hospital's work continued throughout this phase except the planned surgeries.

Covid-19 pandemic has taught lot of things. The fast-moving life came to standstill and gave us time to introspect the lifestyle. We learned the importance of family relations and personal hygiene.

The activities of women program continued, though we could not conduct the planned activities. When new normal will become normal, we will start our activities. Experienced how fast the messages and incidents spread in villages due to mobile phones. Earlier they came to know things when we informed them but now all women are aware of daily happenings. This has its own pros & cons.

Conducted adolescent activities in the open space of the villages instead of schools. We have started the activities with the primary school children. If the concept of the gender neutrality is taught in early childhood, then the change can be brought in the presently prevailing discriminatory behaviour. Yes, to attain this we have to work persistently for years to get the result.

In pandemic health workers are the front-line fighters. It is important to keep giving them the security and encouragement. The team worked very bravely and with responsibility.

We thought that due to pandemic we might have to face financial crisis but our well-wishers, donors, friends took our burden on their shoulders. I thank all of them who have helped Anjali directly or indirectly. Together we will bravely fight the pandemic. May god give us the strength needed.

With best wishes, Anita Shah Managing Trustee Anjali was established in the year 1988. The activities of the organization were initiated on 29th January 1989.

The founders after completing higher education founded Anjali in order to use their skills & capabilities for the underprivileged and the needy.

Anjali is a voluntary organization based in village Ranasan. Ranasan with population of 5000 is a village in Talod taluka of Sabarkantha district in north Gujarat in India.

Beginning was made with health activities, the underprivileged and the needy being the target population. The health activities developed progressively and other activities were included as the needs were perceived.

At present the activities of Anjali are, a 50 bed Anjali Hospital, women's program in 50 interior villages (on the platform of saving groups) and environment enrichment program. Organization is inclined towards development programs for children, youth, and villages.

The soil in Ranasan and its vicinity is rocky & sandy and the climate is dry, windy, hot during 7-8 months of the year and cold during the winter months. The rainfall is less and unpredictable. There are two rivers which run if there is ample of rainfall. There are few lakes & other sources of water. The principal vocation of the people is agriculture. There are few industries in the vicinity. The level of education is low. Most of the population is economically & socially weak.

The majority of the population of this area comes from the communities of Thakors, Dalits, Ravals, Vagharis, Banjaras, Vadi, Pagi, Rabari samaj and migrant adivasi labourers. Most of them earn their livelihood as agriculture or miscellaneous labour. They have not made much progress either economically or socially. This group of people along with other economically weak & distressed section of the population are the main beneficiaries of Anjali's activities.

Vision and Mission Statement

Vision

Promotion of health & all-round development of rural population without any distinction of caste, colour or creed.

- 1. Activities promoting community health & primary health care.

Activities

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(1) <u>Health</u>

Through Anjali Hospital, we could provide services which are briefly tabulated below. Year 2020-21 passed in pandemic. Our area also got affected by the covid-19. First wave did not affect our area but our villages got affected in second wave. Necessary health services were continued. We had only closed eye department and dental departments for two months.

We are providing ophthalmic services since 1995. Cataract Operation and eye refractions were the main services. Many patients have taken advantage of these services and many more are still taking. Over time patients with the retina related problems started to come. We used to refer them to Civil Hospital. It was very difficult for the patients to go to Ahmedabad for the treatment. There is no retina center providing subsidized services in Sabarkantha and Arvalli districts. To provide subsidized retina and glaucoma related services, Anjali has started Retina and Glaucoma center from 06/03/2021. **Dr. Amish Patel (Retina specialist)** gave necessary guidance and support in starting the retina and glaucoma center. He has started coming twice a month as visiting retina specialist.

Retina is very important organ for our eye, which cannot be seen from outside. Retina can be damaged by eye injury, diabetes, high blood pressure, or by disease in other organs like kidney, brain etc.

We can't see retina from the outside and we cannot examine retina the way we can examine the urinary bladder through medical equipment. Because of this to diagnose and decide the method of treatment, we need special equipment to give treatment from outside.

What diseases or disorders will be diagnosed and treated in the retina clinic?

- Disease of the Retina (Macula mostly vision problem)
- Measuring thickness of pupil, when the retina is loose and suspected cases of glaucoma
- Laser treatment on Retina
- Treatment by Intravitreal Injection

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One day Anjali's field supervisor was passing through Ranasan village for saving group's meeting. She saw a woman lying beside the road in the market. She must be lying there for two- three days. She had passed urine and stool in her own clothes (she was lying in her own filth) and flies were buzzing around her. As the place was stinking people passed by covering their nose. The field supervisor instantly informed Anjali Hospital about the situation. Ambulance came with three staff members and took her to Anjali Hospital. She was in semi-conscious state. She was admitted in Anjali Hospital. Nurses slowly removed her clothes and cleaned her. Doctor started the treatment. After sometime she became conscious. Once she gained some strength, gave her a bath and dressed her. When she got cleaned and dressed up then came to know that she is Ranjanben Makwana.

Ranjanben Makwana, age-60 years a native of village 12-15 km away. Since 4-5 years she was staying in Ranasan. She has two married daughters. She collected food & money from people of Ranasan village and from that money she was providing food for her and her husband. They both were addicted to alcohol. After husband's death she was alone. Her daughters took her home but she never stayed there. She lived her own way.

We informed her two daughters. Both came and told the story. After conducting some blood test, the reports showed that she is malnourished. Protein level in her body was very low. So to increase the protein level, gave her costly protein injections. Her hemoglobin was also very low, so, gave her three bottles of blood. Gave food of her choice, fruits, and other important proteins. She was not able to eat much but still we tried to feed her and tried to keep her happy. Her two daughter's financial situation was not good. Ranjanben was admitted in the hospital for 12 days after that she was discharged. She was given all the treatment free of charge. The heartfelt service rendered by Anjali's workers was commendable.

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(2) Women's Activity:

This year started with Corona Pandemic. In April and May'21 due to lockdown, could not conduct saving group's monthly meetings. Stayed connected through mobile phones with the leaders of the groups. In the villages cases of corona were less. But everyone were keeping strict watch and taking caution. Women members were conducting meetings by themselves and were depositing the amount in the bank. This was completely new experience for saving group members and for the CBDA team. Bank had changed the rules. maintaining social distance while standing in a que and frequent usage of sanitizer. To avoid staying in line, women gave us the amount to be deposited in the bank. Sometimes bank informed them to come after 3-4 days. Corona pandemic has taught to saving group members a lot. Initially everyone was taking precautions, as in first wave cases in villages were very low and also it was harvesting time for the farmers. Therefore, effects of lockdown were seen in the villages.

Our workers were courageous and regularly going to the villages for the saving group meetings (Except for two months). They strictly observed Covid-19 protocols of wearing mask, keep social distance and hand sanitization. Women in the village used to laugh at them but workers every time put mask on and made compulsory to wear mask during the meeting. We distributed 2 masks per member to 1800 saving group member.

Whole year women continued savings and lending activity and fulfilled their needs. There were some difficulties but as, most of the them are into farming and milk production, they did not face severe financial strain. The government distributed free of cost grains and deposited the amount in every women's accounts. Furthermore, husbands of most of the women are farmers, therefore in their account also government deposited the amount. That supported them a lot.

We had planned saving group's monthly meetings and other activities for the year. The planned activities were annual meetings at Anjali, training for group leaders, training for newly joined members, exposure trip but because of the pandemic we could not do these activities. As always, we distributed vegetable seeds to women members. They planted the seeds and consumed the vegetables and gave them to their neighbour as well.

We were in dilemma whether to celebrate 8th March, International women's day or not. We put this question to the women and their response was "we don't have to go outside to celebrate". Let's celebrate in the villages. So, 573 members of 69 saving groups from 30 villages took our rallies in their own villages. They build up their self-confidence by calling out women empowering slogans. In the rallies 272 villagers, children, and teachers

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joined the celebration. Now, if there is women empowerment rally to be organized, they will organize with confidence, without any reservation and shout out the slogans without hesitation. They strongly believe that 8th March is International Women's Day, its our day and we should celebrate it.

With support of CARE India, an international organization, to spread awareness regarding corona and as precautionary measure distributed soap, sanitizers bottles, 2 N-95 masks and hand glows to Anganvadi workers and Tedaghar (helpers). Moreover, with the motive of increasing awareness regarding the corona among pregnant women and lactating mothers, distributed soaps, 2 N-95 masks. Informed them what to do, if the lactating mother is corona positive, then how to feed the child and in what matters to be cautious. Along with these, spread government guidelines through mike to reduce the spread of the virus. These activities are successfully carried out by women and men working with the saving groups.

Adolescents Program : Usually from month of June, schools reopen but due the corona pandemic schools didn't open. We are doing adolescent awareness program in 15 high schools. This year could not arrange the program. We were thinking what we can do? At the same time, we learned from other organizations that adolescents are being abused at home. We got worried and decided to start adolescent activities in villages where there are saving groups. After saving group's meeting in the village, we gathered adolescents, discussed on different subjects and informed them. It was easy to gather girls but it was very difficult to gather adolescent boys. Most of the adolescent boys were occupied either playing or helping the family in the farming. Many of them have started working as daily wager. We tried to be in touch with adolescent girls and adolescent boys during the pandemic.

This year we had decided to give self-defense training to 200 adolescent girls but due to pandemic could not conduct the training.

This year we had planned to conduct many activities keeping in center gender neutrality and gender equality in 15 primary school's (From Std.3 to Std.8) students. But due to corona pandemic we could not conduct. Instead of schools we gathered children in open space (fadiyu) and did lot of activities with them. After seeing their enthusiasm, we also enjoyed a lot. As schools were closed, student happily took part in humour with knowledge activities. Keeping in mind the gender equality concept, discussed the difference between a girl and a boy, division of equal work at home, usage of mobile, consequences of tobaco and other addictions trough games, drawing pictures, and stories. If the idea and understanding of gender equality between boys-girls and male-female, are taught in a tender age then gender equality becomes a normal behaviour. With this purpose in mind we are planning our activities.

(1) We began Women Saving Group program from Charanvanta village. In this village there are four saving groups and connected with 80 women. All the groups are working smoothly. Jogmaya is one of the saving groups. There are 12 members. Among these members there is one Dakshaben Jasvantsinh Solanki. Her family income depends on farming and milk production. This was not sufficient income for her family.

Now, in Charvanta village there is no flour mill. For that they have to go to nearby village called Hathrol which is 5 kms away. Dakshaben was thinking what she can do to increase her income and she thought of starting flour mill. The wheels of mind started moving. Her savings were not sufficient to purchase the flour mill so she took loan from the saving group and started flour mill. In a farming village in addition to flour to eat, they need grinded grain for their cattle. Because of this she got lot of grinding work. From this villagers got benefited but more important Dakshaben became Entrepreneur.

(2)Navlpur is approximately 4-5 kms away from Ranasan. In this 40 women are connected with us through four saving groups. Bayoma women saving group started four years ago and is active in saving-lending activity. All the members are regular. Minaben Vikramsinh Chauhan is also member in group who is very enthusiastic. One day during monthly meeting there was discussion regarding gender equality. In our society there is gender inequality and our rituals and recognition of these ritual makes gender inequality stronger. During the discussion Minaben said that her husband helps her in household work. She said when she was having fever, how her husband took care of the house and herself. Most of the women started laughing after hearing this. Anjali's team member explained in detail on this subject. At the end, all women started saying that it would be nice and great relief if their husband also start helping them in household work. Minaben has become group leader. Her husband is supporting her in every situation.

(3) Environment Enrichment Program : Tree Plantation 2020-21

To plant tree sapling and grow tree is one way. To plant seeds in proper places, sprinkle thems in bushes/shrubs is also a method. This year, instead of planting new saplings we took this approach. For that we collected seeds of the trees planted at Anjali campus. Seed were of Karanj, Sebal, Neem, Jambudo, Putranjiva, Parijat, Goras Ambali, Garmalo, Rayan, Khakhro (Kesudo), Arjun Sadad, Etc. In addition to this we protected naturally existing trees/pants like Ingoru, aankalo, limbado, boradi, vikalo, kanaji, etc. Worked on tree plantation along with conservation of trees.

If the tree guard was bent or damaged and there is still a plant inside, we removed the damaged tree guard and fixed a new one. Like that to increase the growth of the trees we trimmed outgrown trees. Last year we had planted grass called stylo hamata and karad, this year we saw good growth. Peculiarity of this grass is, once you plant, it will keep growing every year. For cattle this grass is very useful. Therefore, " what is done, does not go away", that we saw this year.

Many well-wishers come to visit our organization. From this, many are interested in tree plantation and they visit to see the growth and know local trees of the area. Shri Bhanubhai Patel is one of them. He was delighted to see the work and gave some suggestions as well. He is friend of Dr. Bipin Patel (visiting Radiologist). Visiting doctors are also taking interest in tree plantation. Many times they have visited the plantation site and encouraged us. Many friends like Dr. Kiran Patel, Dr. Jignesh Patel, Dr. Timir Mehta, Dr. Kamlesh Patel, Dr. Pravin Patel visited the tree plantation site. The people of Ranasan village too, visit the tree plantation site.

And in the last, we saw a very encouraging and emotional matter as the result of this plantation and it is "nests of birds". While working, we saw many nests of birds with eggs in them. Our desire is to build one house but out here, without difficulty many houses were built and became shelter places and with fruit trees, community kitchens came in to existence Isn't this mesmerising!

(4) Staff Welfare:

Covid-19 pandemic comes first before we talk about the other activities. We celebrated two national festivals 15^{th} August and 26^{th} January with the staff, as corona cases were very few at that time. Flag hoisting of 15the August was done by former Director of Lokbharti Sanosara, Shri Kumudbhai Thakar. Unfortunately, on 24^{th} August we lost him due to corona. He was staying in

Anjali with his son and daughter-in-law, Kirtibhai and Alkaben. We got chance to spent some time with him for which we are fortunate. Other festivals were celebrated with some restrictions.

During Covid-19, the safety of the health workers remained paramount. Gave PPE kit to every worker time to time. Every worker regularly and diligently sanitized Anjali Hospital without any fear. Kept giving guidance to the patients. With the cooperation of all the workers we were able to continue hospital services throughout the year. Issued CoronaProtection insurance for the staff. Two times gave nutritional grain kit to the staff. If any worker got infected with corona, gave them extra leave. When corona cases were very less we sent workers for training.

(5) Covid-19 Work

Corona Pandemic a challenge ! "Together we can definitely give an appropriate Response"

RTPCR Test Center

The nearest RTPCR Test Center was Himatnagar and Modasa which were about 25 kms away and it was always crowded. For the convenience of the villagers from the surrounding area we started RTPCR collection center. The timing for collecting the samples was 10-11 am and charge for the collection was 700 (charge of the laboratory). We took samples of 303 people.

Corona Homecare Program :

Villages were affected in significant numbers with Covid-19 infections from March,2021 onwards. Sudden increase in cases lead to chaos for getting bed in hospital. Patients were suffering from breathlessness because of less oxygen level in body. Government hospitals were full and private hospitals were expensive. (Out of fear and anxious about not getting oxygen when required, many patients, not requiring admission got admitted, there was hospital bed hoarding to some extent). Anjali team thought, we should start something to treat or guide asymptomatic corona positive patients. At the RTPCR center collection, the patients with covid positive started asking questions about what to do next as many of them were asymptomatic. To reduce the unnecessary occupation of the hospital beds and to guide the corona positive patients, Anjali started "Corona Homecare Program". Patients with positive RTPCR test were informed about the program and if asymptomatic patients enrolled in the program, they were given corona homecare kit and homecare guidelines. The kit contained a pulse oximeter, thermometer, medicines, masks, gloves, soap, and sanitizer. Aim of the program was to give psychological relief. So, everyday our team member would call the patient, ask about the health and have a light conversation and jot down the oxygen level and temperature. After that the doctor would call the patients. If the patient got the symptoms then doctor would advise the patient to visit nearby hospital. This program was for 10 days. 52 corona positive patients enrolled in this program from which 95% defeated corona.

Corona Sarvar Kendra (Corona Treatment Center) and Isolation Center

In the villages homes are very small. Therefore, it is very difficult for the corona positive patient to quarantine. We started isolation center for those not having facility at home for the isolation.

Suddenly second wave was at peak. Transmission increased and with that number of deaths increased too. In the villages transmission was more. There was shortage of hospital beds and oxygen. Due to non availability of oxygen, death rate increased. At that time, what to do was big moral question. We wanted to help the patients, and creating an oxygen bed facility was the solution. But due to lack of resources and staff we were in dilemma. In the team, everyone was firm to start the work. So with the faith that "whatever happens god will take care of us", we started Corona Treatment Center. Doctors were not avaible but suddenly we found them, we hired nurses as well. So, with the help of donors we started Corona Treatment Center with 20 oxygen bed capacity. To reduce fear of other patients coming to the hospital, a partition was built between Anjali Hospital main building and multipurpose hall where Corona Treatment Center was created. For this native of Ranasan village Shri Rameshbhai Shah and Meena Print's team provided significant assistance. So, Anjali Hospital health services were also utilized without fear by patients of other illnesses. People from interior villages were staying at home as they could not afford to go to cities and towns. It was heartbreaking to see them walking in Corona Treatment Centre with 60/65/70/80/85 % oxygen levels. Dr Nita Dilliwala a physician from Ahmedabad volunteered to stay and see these patients daily. Most of the patients were from socioeconomical weak strata of the society. Also, they had feeling of insecurity of going to cities. So, our responsibility increased. The admitted patients were treated with minimal charge initially which was discontinued and all the patients were kept and treated free of any charge. For this facility 3 MBBS doctors and 12 nurses, 4 cleaning staff were hired. All staff took good care of all these patients medically, physically and psychologically by different activities like games, devotional songs and motivational talks. As patients were very weak and were not eating well, they were provided frequent small meals. sprouted lentils, soups, fruit, milk,

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tea and juice. Around 90 patients were admitted and treated.

We also started Out Patent Department (OPD) for fever and suspected cases of Corona with free rapid antigen test to diagnose and provided medicines free of charge. 404 patients registered in OPD.

Corona taught the people to wash their hands and stay clean but the hospital management learned the new and unexpected lesson. Usually when patient gets admitted in the hospital he is always accompanied by the relative (in India 3-4 relatives). The relatives take care of patient's food, taking them to bathroom, change clothes etc. and when the relative is there patient gets psychological relief which helps in recovery. During the corona period, relatives were not allowed to stay with the patient. So all the responsibilities mentioned above came upon the hospital management and specially on nurses. Nurses and volunteers became their relatives. Second wave of the corona taught us how to take complete care of the patient.

The year started with lockdown. An event that was not heard of, where everything is closed. In addition, there was fear of infection. We had to make arrangements for patients, their relatives, and staff coming from outside. Number of patients in the hospital decreased. All the activities except emergency discontinued for two months.

As we are located in remote area and there is no other facility available, we had to continue our services like delivery, emergency treatment, and treatment of asthma, diabetes, BP, and epilepsy patients. Patients were very less but we had to retain the doctors, nurses, paramedical staff, and other staff. As the hospital income significantly reduced, a discussion was conducted with staff members in which all the staff members agreed for temporary reduction in salary and lay off of newly appointed staff.

In March, 2021 and after that villages started getting affected and due to lack of oxygen and oxygen beds the horror of the disease and uncertainty grew day by day. Anjali started RTPCR collection center, homecare program, isolation centre, and Corona Treatment Center with 20 oxygen bed.

We could meet with cost of the newly created facilities, salary of the new staff, take insurance of all the staff members for Covid-19, meet the recurring cost of all the Covid-19 activities including recurring cost of Corona Treatment Center.

All these became possible due to the following factors:

- 1. Understanding and loyalty towards the duty of Anjali's staff members.
- 2. Incredible response of the donation appeal made in July 2020.
- 3. When due to lack of oxygen and oxygen beds situation worsened, few donors called to ensure all the help needed and kept asking via calls to know what we have decided.
- 4. Doctor friends encouraged us to start oxygen beds and ensure their full support.
- 5. Foreign organizations and individuals provided significant help and support.
- 6. Om Shah a class 9 student in USA and a class 9 student Palash Shah in Vadodara conducted online fund collection drive to support Anjali's fight against Corona and collected significant amount
- 7. **Dr. Nitaben Dillivala,** physician from Ahmedabad stayed at Ranasan and treated the admitted patients in Corona Treatment Center and patients coming in fever clinics. She volunteered her work and also collected significant donation from her friends.

We are grateful to all, mentioned above.

This is how he became one of the founder trustees of Anjali. He remained present in every meeting and guided us. We will miss him in our trustee meetings. We pray almighty to give peace to him.

Following condolence resolution was passed in trustee meeting.

"One of the founder trustees of Anjali, Dr. Dinkarbhai Dave passed away on 29.05.2020 after long illness. He was a well-known social worker of Sabarkantha district. He was MD Physician and joined Dr. Rasiklal Sarvajanik Hospital immediately after passing MD medicine and lived his whole life dedicated to health care of rural population. He was known by affectionate name of "Dave Saheb" in Sabarkantha and Arvalli district of north Gujarat. He was associated with Anjali since inception, he continued providing warmth and guidance. His loving nature will be remembered forever. He will be very much missed in medical field and social work in this area. All the trustees of Anjali unanimously pass this resolution paying homage to him and pray lord to grant him peace."

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
