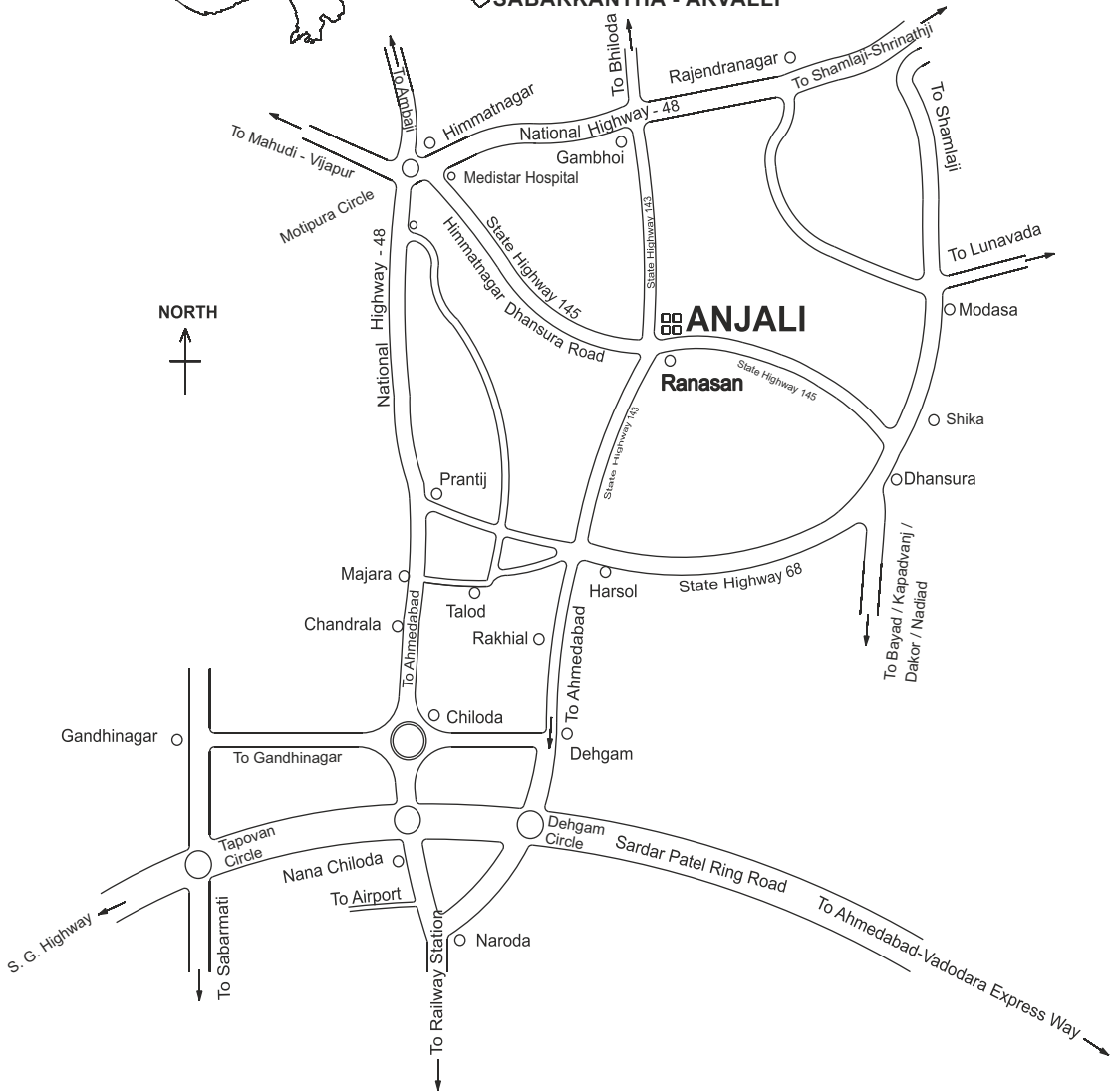

Dear Donors, Well Wishers & Friends,
Hope this finds you all well!

We are pleased to present to you the activity and financial report of Anjali for the year 2022-23.

After two years of the Covid-19 pandemic, 2022-23 remained somewhat fear-free. From April 2022 to June 2022, there was a little tension, but it started getting back to normal. According to experts, the covid-19 virus seems to have become endemic now.

Thus, after a gap of two years, non-medical activities started as usual.

Anjali was able to preserve the comfort and convenience of the patients in the hospital. Anjali Hospital's medical store underwent changes in line with the times. Now, the cost of diagnostic tests and medicines has increased more than before. We may not afford the costly diagnostic tools (CT scan, MRI etc.) but we can provide relief to the needy for medicines. Generally, the cost of everything has increased after Covid-19 hence the need for subsidized medicines.

Women activities have also gained momentum. Now the young women also join the program. There is a lot of change in their understanding. Social media has made women more active and wiser in the time of Covid-19. After the organic farming exposure visit, many of the them have come forward to experiment with organic farming.

Tailoring training classes have been started to improve the skills of widows and distressed women. Along with them, other women and girls also got a chance to stand on their own feet and are on their way to becoming self-reliant.

Even if trees are planted, if they are not taken care of for a few consecutive years (like a child), time, energy and money is wasted. Therefore, it is imperative to be patient and take care of the trees. Thus, at this stage engaged in maintenance and grooming of trees.

Government laws, rules for voluntary organizations are changing. Taking this change positively will create a good impression of our organization and activities. Anjali has already been following the necessary and mandatory laws and regulations in administration, so the problem is less. But yes.... the administrative work has definitely increased. Table work, paper work has increased but finally the transparency of the organization has to be visible.

On behalf of Anjali, I would like to thank you for providing financial help , your time, support & cooperation and guidance throughout the year.

Anjali was established in the year 1988. The activities of the organization were initiated on 29th January 1989.

The founders after completing higher education founded Anjali in order to use their skills & capabilities for the poor and the needy.

Anjali is a voluntary organization based in village Ranasan. Ranasan with population of 5000 is in Talod taluka of Sabarkantha district in north Gujarat in India

Beginning was made with health activities, the poor and the needy being the target population. The health activities developed progressively and other activities were included as the needs were perceived.

At present the activities of Anjali are, a 75 bed Anjali Hospital, women's program in 52 interior villages (on the platform of saving groups) and environment enrichment program. Organization is inclined towards development programs for children, youth, and villages

The soil in Ranasan and its vicinity is rocky & sandy and the climate is dry, windy, hot during 7-8 months of the year and cold during the winter months. The rainfall is less and unpredictable. There are two rivers which run if there is ample of rainfall. There are few lakes & other sources of water. The principal vocation of the people is agriculture. There are few industries in the vicinity. The level of education is low. Most of the population is economically & socially weak.

The majority of the population of this area comes from the communities of Thakors, Dalits, Ravals, Vagharis, Banjaras, Vadi, Pagi, Rabari samaj and migrant adivasi labourers. Most of them earn their livelihood as agriculture or miscellaneous labour. They have not made much progress either economically or socially. This group of people along with other economically weak & distressed section of the population are the main beneficiaries of Anjali's activities.

Vision and Mission Statement

Vision

Promotion of health & all-round development of rural population without any distinction of caste, colour or creed.

Mission

1. Activities promoting community health & primary health care.
2. Rational- ethical & subsidised rural hospital services.
3. Empowering education to women, children, youth and over all development of rural population & rural areas.
4. Environment enrichment by tree plantation, rain water harvesting & use of renewable energy.
5. Activities conducive to & fostering moral and ethical values.

(1) **Health**

Purpose: To develop medical services in the hospital targeting the underprivileged and needy people of the area so that the common man of the area can avail the services of the hospital without any hesitation, get treatment and medicine at an affordable and concessional cost, so that those who require medicines for long time or lifelong can continue medicines without interruption to avoid complications.

Health activities occupy a major place in Anjali's activities which are mainly provided by Anjali Hospital and Out-reach (outside the hospital in villages) health program of Anjali.

A detailed introduction to the medical facilities available at Anjali Hospital

i) Emergency Treatment

As Anjali Hospital is an important place for emergency treatment in this interior rural area, a 24x7 facility has been created for which suitably qualified medical doctors (Medical Officers) are also available 24x7.

This service is mainly used by common people, tribal agricultural and local labourers. Sudden seizures, Snake/scorpion/dog/bee bite, consumption of /exposure to poison, decrease/increase in diabetes, chest pain, road accidents, sudden onset of fever, acute exacerbation of chronic illness, sudden onset of childbirth pain etc are often attended emergency conditions.

Along with this facility, 24 hours subsidised / free Ambulance service has also been made available at any time of the day or night to the patient, so that patient in need can be brought to the hospital or moved out to higher center immediately.

ii) Child birth Facility

Primary health facilities and 24x7 facility for care of expectant mothers and childbirth are basic requirements of any developed society.

This facility has been created in Anjali since the first day of establishment and has been running continuously. It is a fact that expert doctors do not want to come to the villages, but every possible effort is made to get and retain them and at the same time the medical officers and nursing staff here have also been trained and made competent in the field of midwifery. Delivery and caesarean operation are made available at concessional rates. 90% concessions in childbirth and Caesarian operation have been made available for poor and tribal agricultural labourers.

iii) Medical Treatment

For patients with fever, Cough, BP, Diabetes, Thyroid diseases, Epilepsy, Asthma and respiratory diseases, heart problems, stomach and diarrhea problems, urinary and kidney problems there is Medicine department. Care has been taken to incorporate special provisions for medical treatment of diseases requiring long-term or life-long medication (NCD-Non Communicable Diseases). Medicine department consists of OPD and

Indoor sections. A MD Physician is available for 3-4 hours daily who can guide the MBBS doctors in medical treatment as well as examine the admitted patients daily. Physician is also available for support and guidance for 24 hours on phone and WhatsApp.

iv) Eye Department

Eye work in Anjali Hospital started with eye camp in the year 1994. At that time cataract operation camps were started with the support of Seva-Rural, Jhagadia. A lot more patients then expected came to the first camp, from which it was felt that the number of patients who have cataracts but have not been operated is very large. So, yearly eye camps were held. There was significant support for these camps from the students of Shri C. V. Gandhi high school, Ranasan and volunteers from surrounding villages. From 1997, Ophthalmologist's OPD was started twice a week which was gradually increased to thrice and then daily. There are two eye doctors every day for the last one year.

The need for cataract surgery in this area and considering the limited facilities for quality eye care for the underprivileged, efforts are being made to provide services for as many type of eye problems as possible through Anjali. SICS type cataract surgery was made free of any charge many years back due to which quality eye treatment was made available to the common man. Year by year, the number of patients coming for eye surgery and eye examination is increasing.

v) Retina Clinic

As the number of patients in the eye department increased, more patients with retinal problems were noticed and advised to go to the Ahmedabad Civil Hospital. It was observed that 75% of the referred patients did not go to Ahmedabad as it was far away and here in Sabarkantha and Aravalli districts, government and trust hospitals do not have services for retinal examination and medical treatment of retinal problems. In such a situation, retina center was established in Anjali Hospital where examination and treatment are available at concessional rates.

Every Friday Retina Surgeon comes from Ahmedabad. At present, medical work of the retina is carried out in which injections and laser treatment are given in the eye. Shortly Retinal surgery is also under consideration.

vi) General Surgery

General surgical operations are an essential department of any hospital system. Due to non-availability of full-time surgeons who can stay full-time in the campus, two surgeons & two Anesthetist have been coming in turn without any salary for a long time to serve every Saturday. They conduct OPD and operations on the day of visit. Besides, these two doctors also conduct three free surgical operation camps in a year. (One camp is in Poshina tribal area of Sabarkantha district, one camp in Kasana tribal area of Meghraj in Arvalli district and one camp in Anjali Hospital Ranasan.) In addition to the two surgeons mentioned above, surgeons and anesthetists from Surat and Himmatnagar also provide their services in these surgical camps.

vii) Dental

Since the facilities and awareness for dental problems are low in the villages, the services of a dentist have been made available in Anjali for since last 12 years. Dentist is available daily in Anjali Hospital.

viii) ENT Department

ENT services were introduced during this year. There is OPD twice a week on every Tuesday and Friday and ENT operations are performed every Thursday. This department is also equipped with modern equipment for investigations and operations. (Front Cover Photo)

ix) Skin

Skin OPD has been running four times a week for more than 25 years. The skin department is well known and trusted in the area.

x) Mental Health

Mental health services commenced 4 years back. Currently, a psychiatrist is available for three hours on every Tuesday and Thursday. In order to encourage patients with mental health problems to come to the Psychiatrist and continue treatment for long period, medicines for mental health patients are provided at 50% or 75% concessions.

Anjali's Out-reach (interior villages) eye and surgical operation programs:

Providing health care by going to interior villages started with the program of examining pregnant women in 32 surrounding villages. This program lasted for 4 years, after which diagnostic camps were started for cataract operations in Poshina and Meghraj area of Sabarkantha which are at a distance of 125 km and 65 kms respectively. Along with this, surgical operation camps were also started in these areas. Seeing the need for these services, eye camps were started in a few other villages, but the biggest difficulty was getting the patients to the hospital for operations after the diagnosis of cataract. Bringing and dropping off patients in goods transport vehicles was not convenient for patients. (Due to the heat and cold as well as the patients had to sit on the floor of the vehicle). A 46-seater bus was purchased from the CSR donation amount received from a regular donor of Anjali to transport these patients.

Since last 5-6 years we have been doing eye camp every week on Wednesday. And we conduct three surgical operation camps in a year.

After the arrival of bus for patients, 2 eye camps and 1 surgical operation camp have been made possible in the tribal taluka of Poshina and 2 in the tribal area of Meghraj are regularly conducted.

2. Womens Programm

Purpose: Women come together on the platform of small saving groups. By involving them in planning and management, increase their self-confidence and self-esteem.

We have been working since 2003 to involve women in the development process. We are trying to empower women through many activities by facilitating and providing guidance on saving and credit as well as many necessary trainings, vegetable seeds for kitchen gardening and animal husbandry.

Attended and facilitated monthly meetings of each saving group throughout the year. Along with the savings & loans, we have been explaining “what is a good saving group”. The work continued throughout the year with discussions on what is the role of the leaders of a good saving group, regular repayment of loans, qualities of good members.

Yes, for some of the activities have a great enthusiasm and they look forward eagerly, like yearly tour and outing, 8th March rally on Women's Day, annual saving group meetings in Anjali campus, Convention of women members every three-four year at Anjali in Ranasan etc. All these activities are celebrated as special occasions and symbol of liberation. The preparations are in full swing, and when that day arrives the joy on their faces is no less than that of winning a battle.

For Kitchen gardening five kinds of vegetable seeds were given to all the members of the saving groups on time and we are trying to give seeds of reliable quality, so that the women can grow vegetables at home using natural methods and include them in their diet liberally. By doing this activity continuously, it can be seen that most of the women sow seeds and take good care. Vegetable vines can be seen from house to house in the villages of women's program activities. Some members enthusiastically bring their vegetables for consumption in hospital kitchen. Through this activity they also save some money

Continued to help 185 Covid-19 widows in the villages of Women's program by giving seeds to them. Last year, Juvar (Sorghum millet) and Bajari (pearl millet) seeds were given to the widows so that they could sow the field on

time. As some of them do not have access to water, 38 women of 13 villages were given Juvar (Sorghum) seeds in the rainy season, so the widows did not have to spend money on seeds and could get crop harvest by farming the seeds.

On 8th March, carry out rally in their villages with catchy slogans, women and children join the rally. This year also, women of 32 villages participated in the rally with enthusiasm and exuberance. Besides slogans in the rally, with an idea of creating an identity of activities of saving groups in their individual villages most of the women members have decided to plant a basil plant (holy Tulsi plant) and a rose plant in front their houses. The result of this will can be seen in the next year.

Organic Farming Education and influence of Travel and Tour:

Last year an explanation and understanding was given on the use of chemical insecticides and fertilizers causing diseases like cancer and other physical damage to the body. Also, as a result of organizing a tour to demonstrate organic farming experiments, 67 women of the saving groups have conducted small experiments in their own farms under the guidance they received and have got results. such as

- Used Akada (*Calotropis gigantea*) leaves.
- Used sour buttermilk.
- Used cow urine.
- Made a solution of flour and beans and used it as a disinfectant.
- Used cow dung manure.

Let's hope that as such experiments go on and such food grains are produced by working towards organic farming. Once such an activity is started, it has to be constantly monitored and nurtured.

Each saving group has its own account in schedule bank. The transaction are carried out with the signatures of the women leaders after making a resolution in the monthly meetings of the respective saving group in their respective villages. The women members of each saving group manage their groups themselves. No worker of Anjali has name in their bank account. Anjali's workers act only as facilitators. Every saving group is a Self-Help Savings group in true sense. Women members save themselves, initiate internal credit as funds accumulate. Use the funds collected in their saving group and continue to save and collect. Thus, the savings will continue to grow and new proposes will be fulfilled. For safety purpose, they do not lend money outside the members of the own saving group. The interest rate of the loan is determined by the members. As the interest income from the loan is distributed among the members in ratio of their savings, most of the time there is no interest on the loan.

* Each member took loan multiple times. About 3.5 times the amount of the savings was in circulation and in use for the various needs of the women members.

Stories of Empowerment

These are few examples of how members of saving groups are moving in the direction of becoming competent and empowered by joining Anjali's Women Programs. (As such each story is their personal story)

Everyone is striving for financial gains. For these financial gains they must do something to the best of their ability, the foremost being credit for animal husbandry and agriculture (purchase of Cows / Buffaloes, seeds and Fertilisers for agriculture). But there are other needs which include education, health, social events, property creation, weddings of their children, illness, education fees, vehicle installments, house building, etc. Many types of financial needs have been fulfilled through these saving groups. It seems that Saving Groups have come to occupy an important place in the family.

1. Widow becomes head of the house:

Laxmiben Rajubhai Parmar of Bayal Dhankarol village is attached to Gopi Mahila Bachat Mandal. They have a small family. Head of the house (her husband) passed away. She works as a daily labourer and does some sewing. She thought that it would be better if they set up a small shop. The idea was presented to all the members in the monthly meeting of her saving group. All the members agreed to lend as per her requirement. A resolution was passed in the meeting. Laxmiben also got a shop sanctioned from the village panchayat and started selling seasonal items by building a small tin roof shop. After that boldly started keeping other cutlery items. Devoting more of her time to the shop, she also started doing sewing work there. Her children also help her in these activities. From this shop they can earn seven to eight thousand per month. She participates quite actively in her saving group and pays installments on time.

2 Understang the need of children education:

Varshaben Jagdishbhai Bhunatar is a member of Ramdevpir Mahila Bachat Mandal, of Hathrol village. Now members are able to understand the importance of education. There has also been an increase in giving education to daughters. Varshaben has five daughters. Educates all her daughters. One daughter wanted to do 11-12 science., another daughter wanted to study nursing. She did not have a big amount of money for education of their daughters. Respecting the desires of her daughters, without any hesitation she took loan of Rs one lakh from her saving group and paid fees. Both are now studying. Isn't it surprising? How a mother was able to make full use of small savings while staying in the saving group. Salutations to this mother and the members of the saving group.

3 Where there is a will, there is a way

Manishaben Vijaysinh Makwana, leader of Bhairavadada Mahila Bachat Mandal of Kabodari village. When daughters go to in-laws house their world changes. We have a saying here “Sasare Sakar Na Hoy” (There is no sugar at in-law's house). This was proved wrong by Manishaben's family. Manishaben, a member of saving group, felt like pursuing the idea of “doing what we really like” and thus began her new journey. It occurred to Manishaben that she wants to join Anjali's tailoring class. She joined it and successfully completed the 3-month course. During the tailoring course which is conducted in premises where Anjali Hospital is also situated, she got an idea that if all these girls can study and become nurses why can't she study and become a nurse? She revealed her thoughts to Anjali's workers who are with saving groups. She was told that, as you have passed class 12, surely such education can be obtained. But, was this possible for Manishaben as she had the responsibility of housework, farming, small children, joint family etc.? She was in dilemma. She revealed this doubt in saving group meeting which was being held in her street, her in-laws were also present there. They showed desire to help her and her husband also supported her decision. She filled admission form for GNM course and got admission in nearby Rupal Nursing College. Presently she is studying nursing with cooperation of the family members. She told her husband & in-laws that in village daughter in law wears saree but in the college all ladies are coming wearing dress? To facilitate her studies, she was allowed to wear dress!! All the members of the family deserve appreciation, isn't it... In-laws became father & mother and it was picture perfect of a joint family. Presently Manishaben is in second year of three-year GNM course, Congratulations and best wishes to her.

4 Desire for financial income with self-respect:

The meeting of the Prerna Mahila Bachat Mandal of Hathrol village was held at Lalitaben's house. In the meeting of this group, there was a mention of Tailoring training classes that have started in Anjali. Her married daughter was present as she had come from Raigad (30 kms away). Very next day she came and filled admission form and got herself admitted in the first batch. Though her home was a little far she attended the classes regularly. She was a slow learner but she had firm determination. So, she tried to learn with courage by working hard. Slowly and gradually, she kept learning and learned each pattern. The tutor of the classes, patiently kept helping her. As a result, she successfully completed the training course. She gave more attention to making blouses and dresses and developed the skills. At home she told them that she wants to bring a sewing machine, which she bought equipped with motor and interlock. She is getting sewing work. As she is working diligently, she keeps getting work. Thus, she is strengthening her financial aspect with self-respect.

Kishor Kishori Program (Adolescent girls' and boys' program):

We are doing Kishor Kishori program (Adolescence girls & boys' program) in 9 villages with 235 boys and 228 girls by going to high school. We also do it in the village with 220 teenage girls in these villages who are not going to school. Every month we do different awareness issues with them by different methods and make them interesting, so that they understand the menstrual cycle, understand the importance of hygiene. What kind of changes occur in the body at this age and can be seen in behavior. We explain it and give guidance. As well as positivity, good and responsible speech and behavior, friendship, respecting others, addiction and other topics are covered.

We organize extensive self-defense training for the girls of class 9 and 10 and consolidate the information in detail. This year two teenage girls were prepared and participated in two state level events. Thus, through many activities we are trying to increase their confidence and provide correct information.

Activities of Primary School Children:

Tomorrow's Future are "Our Children" What we can give to our children at an early age is of great importance. Because tomorrow is to be made brighter. We go to 15 primary schools in 15 villages and do activities with 870 children. Like – we try to

explain through games, stories, pictorial examples, songs, demonstrations. In which we decide the choice of issue and method keeping in mind the age of the children. In particular, we keep giving insight into issues like cleanliness, hygiene, gender, personal security child rights, human anatomy, touch by friends, bad touch, bullying, addiction, nutrition.

Tailoring training class

During the Covid-19 epidemic, many young women have become widows. At that time provided food kits to them, provided vegetable seeds, agricultural seeds and did what was possible. It was contemplated, “what can be done for them,” as many of them were young. Tailoring classes was one thing that can provide some income at home after the training. As such, for longtime we were contemplating some activity for the women which could generate some income but could not give a concrete form. Program of Tailoring classes was thus implemented.

Due to social restrictions, social customs and restrictions imposed by caste, a smaller number of such women could join. But this gave the other women and girls of the same communities a chance and the program started.

There are 15 machines in a class and we admit 15 members to this training. So that the machine can be used all the time. So far 6 batches have completed training and currently a batch is ongoing. This tailoring class is conducted free of charge so that a good number of girls and women can benefit. We have been following up on what the members do after getting trained and are constantly in touch with them. 80% of them have bought a new or old machine at their home and started the sewing work. The training of this sewing class has become a means of financial gains. Somewhere, if someone is stuck in making samples, she can call or come in person to seek help and guidance from the tutor and with courage she can generate income by herself. So far **83** women from **30** villages have been able to take tailoring training.

1. Environment

Tree plantation work continued during the year. The main activities were replacing around 1000 trees which had dried up or were not growing, watering of trees and pruning. Years of experience have shown that when trees grow well, they go out of the tree guard, this being grazing land the top part which has come out of the tree guard is eaten by animals especially

part which has come out of the tree guard is eaten by animals especially Goats. Once this happens the growth gets stunted as again next year same thing happens. Various means like putting thorns at the top of tree guard and covering about 10 feet around the tree guard with thorns did not succeed as people took away the thorn branches once they dried, for firewood.

This year a strong plastic net was purchased and wrapped around the tree guard on the top so that more than one foot was above the top of the tree guard. About 1900 tree guard were protected, the results will be visible next year. (See photo on the front cover page) and around 1000 trees have been planted.

2. Development of workers

For medical officers of Anjali Hospital and other hospital staff a symposium was organised on BLS – CPR, Insecticide poisoning, Snake Bite and basic ECG reading was explained by Dr Ritesh Shah and his team. Doctors from Shamlaji and Vatrak hospitals also participated in the symposium.

A seminar was conducted by Dr Amish Patel (Retina Surgeon) giving guidance on operation theater protocols / scrubbing and autoclave. Doctors and staff of Anjali Hospital and doctors and staff of Shamlaji Hospital participated.

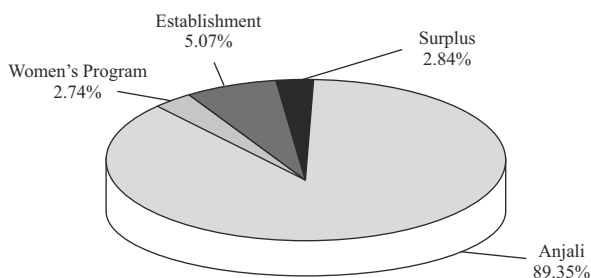

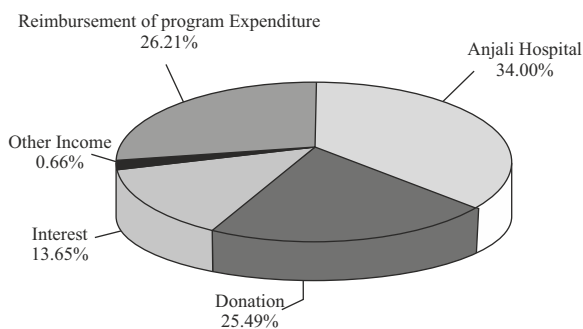

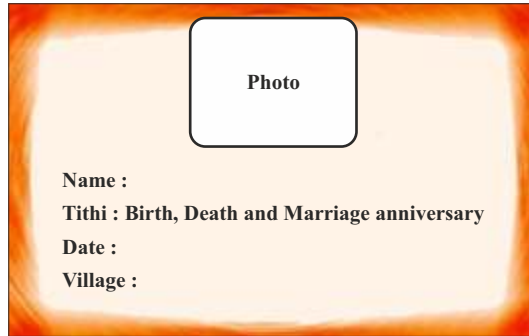
