

## Project-SuATI

The SuATI (Support of Agroecological Transformation Processes in India) project aims to promote sustainable agricultural practices in the Hatigaon and Chutki clusters. Supported by GIZ and implemented by Ajagar Social Circle, the project focuses on reducing reliance on chemical inputs and enhancing ecological balance through natural farming techniques. It also aims to increase the area under natural farming in both clusters.

Farmers receive training on natural farming practices, including the use of bio-fertilizers and bio-pesticides. Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) exercises engage community members to identify local needs and resources, using techniques like social mapping and bio-resource flow analysis.

Demonstration plots are established to showcase natural farming methods, providing practical examples for local farmers. Additionally, exposure visits to model farms such as Pabhoi Greens offer hands-on experience and insights into sustainable agriculture.

The project emphasizes community engagement and capacity building, fostering collaboration and active participation. Overall, SuATI aims to create a sustainable agricultural ecosystem that benefits both the environment and farming communities, while expanding the reach of natural farming practices



# Success Story: Monomi Rabha - Empowered Weaver from Kishoridubi

Monomi Rabha, a 27-year-old from Kishoridubi village, faced financial hardships in her landless family, dependent on her husband's daily wages. Though skilled in weaving, her talents were limited to personal use. During a survey, our team discovered her potential and selected her as a beneficiary of the LEDP project. We provided her with extensive training and market linkage support. With a small investment, Monomi purchased raw materials and, under the guidance of professional trainers, began crafting exquisite handloom products. Our project also secured market and input linkages, enabling her to sell her products at their true value. This intervention significantly boosted her family's income, allowing Monomi to live a dignified life. Her success story now inspires other women in her community, demonstrating the transformative power of skill development and market access. Monomi's journey from a modest weaver to a successful entrepreneur exemplifies the profound impact of targeted support on individual lives and communities.

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
## Project- Assam Flood Relief Support in India: Livelihood Restoration through Agriculture


The "Assam Flood Relief Support in India: Livelihood Restoration through Agriculture and Livestock" project, funded by DASRA and implemented by Ajagar Social Circle, addresses both the immediate and long-term needs of flood-affected communities in Goalpara district. This initiative provides essential relief supplies to victims of the devastating floods, offering critical support during their time of need.

In addition to immediate relief, the project focuses on sustainable livelihood restoration. We assist families in rehabilitating their farmlands by providing seeds, tools, and training to restart and improve agricultural activities. Moreover, we support the recovery of livestock, supplying families with resources and training to rebuild their livestock herds, which are vital for their income and food security.

By helping these families regain their primary sources of income through agriculture and livestock farming, the project promotes economic stability and resilience against future disasters. This comprehensive approach ensures that both crop production and livestock management are addressed.

Through a combination of immediate relief and long-term support, the "Assam Flood Relief Support in India" project aims to restore livelihoods, enhance food security, and build a more resilient community in Goalpara district.

Dasra and Tarsadia Foundation have launched the Rebuild India Fund — a long-term resilience fund that commits 5 years of general operating grants (USD 13,500 per year, per NGO) and capacity-building support to 100 new grassroots NGOs each year. The fund will be supported by a cohort of global philanthropic partners committed to providing long-term, funding to NGO strategies based on local knowledge and systems. The Rebuild India Fund aims to challenge existing practices of philanthropy and encourage open dialogue on giving principles such as trust-based philanthropy, flexible and long-term funding, supporting proximate leaders, and more, with the larger goal of creating an empathetic ecosystem.




### Project- Every Child in School

The "Every Child in School" program, funded by Smile Foundation and implemented by Ajagar Social Circle, aims to uplift underprivileged children in Goalpara, Assam. This project targets students who are disengaged from learning due to distractions like excessive mobile phone use and lack of focus. Through this program, the school staff, supported by Smile Foundation, identified and provided personalized attention to these students. Parents were also guided to change habits that might negatively impact their children. The focused support and regular monitoring led to improved student behavior, increased focus, and a renewed interest in learning. Parents also adapted positively, enhancing the home learning environment.

The program included diverse activities such as storytelling, poem recitation, drawing, quizzes, art and craft activities, yoga, and project-based learning. Educational tools like laptops, projectors, globes, charts, and maps were utilized to enrich the learning experience. The school celebrated various events, contributing to a dynamic educational atmosphere.

This program showcases the power of targeted interventions and collaborative efforts in transforming education and fostering personal growth among the children of Goalpara.





## Tanabi Ray's Journey: A Tale of Transformation

Tanabi Ray, a 15-year-old class 9 student, lives with her hardworking father, a driver, and her devoted mother, a housewife, in Goalpara, Assam. Despite her bright potential, Tanabi's academic performance was hampered by excessive mobile phone use and lack of focus in class.

Before the intervention, Tanabi was inattentive, irregular in attendance, and disengaged from activities.
The "Every Child in School" project, a collaboration between Smile Foundation and Ajagar Social Circle,
recognized her potential and stepped in to help. They explained the adverse effects of mobile overuse and
worked closely with her parents to adopt healthier routines.

With individualized attention and regular teacher interactions, Tanabi's transformation was remarkable. Her academic performance improved, she became more attentive and regular in her classes, and she began actively participating in co-curricular activities.

Today, Tanabi stands as a testament to the power of dedicated support and community intervention, illustrating how challenges can be overcome with the right guidance, unlocking a brighter future filled with potential and promise






# **Prashanta Barman**Farmer, 48 Village- Kishordubi, Goalpara

My Success Story!

"In 2017, I had the opportunity to join Ajagar Social Circle as a beneficiary of the Krishak Samridhi Project, supported by NABARD. Before this, I was working my 7 bighas of land with modest yields. Everything changed for me in January 2018 when I received a Shallow Tubewell (STW) through the RIDF scheme, thanks to Ajagar Social Circle. With the STW, I began cultivating Summer paddy on 3 bighas of land, resulting in a profit of Rs 40,000/-. Additionally, growing Joha rice brought in another Rs 40,000/-. These profits enabled me to purchase a power tiller through the RKVY scheme in 2019. Ajagar Social Circle continued to support my endeavors, helping me secure a bank loan of Rs 1,20,000/- to start a dairy farm with a Jersey cow. Today, I own 5 Jersey cows, a Shallow Tubewell, and a power tiller. My annual income has grown substantially, with Rs 60,000/- from paddy farming, Rs 20,000/- from the power tiller, and Rs 5,40,000/- from dairy farming.

The support from Ajagar Social Circle has transformed my agricultural practice into a profitable and sustainable business, improving my livelihood significantly."
