This Financial Year 2018-19, the North East Zone Welfare Development Society (NEZWDS) , undertake the task of conducting there are more than 1000 (One Thousand) Tea Gardens in Assam, where workers orginally coming from Orissa, Madhya Pradesh, Bihar, Andhra Pradesh and West bengal have engeged themselves and subsequently settled in assam permanently. There are khown as Tea and Ex-Tea garden tribes, who are recognized as other Backward classes by the government. These people not only constitute a sizable chunk of the population in the state but also play major role in tea production of the State (about 53% of the total tea production of the country)and this contributes to the economy of the state.



Famed worldwide for the captive taste of its tea, Assam is world's largest tea-plantation area (sprawling over an area of 216200 hectares). The tea gardens add further charm to Assam's already picturesque panorama. More than 100 tea estates have their gardens here in Assam; like Tata Group of Companies, Williamson Tea Estates, Ambika and Jamirah.

With the beginning of March, the cropping season starts and last till December. Topping the charts in tea-garden tourism, the plantation are spread on the banks.

Agriculture the main source of is income for the entire national economy India. Still a major portion of national economy depends on the agriculture sector in our country. Therefore, every rural based schemes and project are targeting development in our country. Our co-ordinator was engaged in various activities agriculture project specially related to Agriculture sector. Among them the information dissemination, linkage amongst the farmers. Our co-ordinators have been organized awareness meeting and dissemination of information regarding the Agriculture sector in the different places at Boko ,Chamaria of Kamrup district.

Our co-ordinators visited STW and Tractor groups and in land development groups in different villages under different ADO circle in Kamrup District. Co-ordinators are processing the farmer's contribution for the different Scheme also examines their logbook and the register, and help them to maintain the different books

We have also done base-line surveys of land development in different ADO circle in Kamrup District. Our co-ordinators have visited some Tractor groups for Bank Linkage where some groups of Tractor group under different branch of nationalize bank of Kamrup District has been finalized for bank loan. In this respective bank, our co-ordinator helped some groups to opening bank A/C. and linkage the groups with their respective banks. Co-ordinators also visited all the banks and also the zonal office; for helping the some groups for sanction the loan.



Apart from the specific task were also engaged in other several activities with the beneficiaries. Among them our co-ordinators have formed tractor groups in all the division of Kamrup district, also visited the existing groups of tractor, STW and LLP, monitoring their activities and also visited their crops field.

(i) Group of farmers having 2.00ha (15 bighas) of contiguous cultivable agricultural land for assured irrigation shall be eligible for admissible subsidy.

(ii) Individual farmer having 2.00ha (15 bighas) of contiguous cultivable agricultural land for assured irrigation shall be eligible for admissible subsidy.

(iii) Farmers who do not possess 2.00ha of contiguous cultivable land, he/she may include the adjacent cultivable agricultural land of the adjacent farmers to cover a command area of minimum 2.00ha for assured irrigation, subject to condition that an agreement (Annexure IV (D)) will be made

between the individual farmer and adjacent farmers for equitable distribution of water for irrigation and the leader of the group of farmers shall be eligible for admissible subsidy. b) In case of STW with Diesel Centrifugal Pump-set/ Electrical Pump set (Surface Pump/ Submersible Pump), the STW shall be installed by the beneficiary from their own or through the empanelled Contractor as per approved plan, estimate & specification. Subsidy for the component will be reimbursed as per provision as stated in Annexure-I to implementing farmer/Empanelled contractor/Supplier of Pump set. c) In case of STW with Electrical Pump-set in cluster of 10 Nos. of STW with 25 KVA Sub-station and in cluster of 30 Nos. of STW with 63 KVA Sub-station, the area of cultivable land should be 20 hectare and 60 hectare respectively and the total area must be a contiguous cultivable agricultural land. d) In case of Solar Photovoltaic Water Pumping System of Surface pump (2HP) and Submersible Pump (2HP) a premium of Rs 10,000/- as advance payment (part of the farmers share), payable to supplier of SPV pumping system, in the form of Bank Draft drawn in favour of the supplier will be deposited to EE(A)/AEE(A) of the District by the beneficiary along with the application. e) A premium of Rs 2,500/- (Two Thousand Five Hundred only) for each STW in a cluster shall be deposited by each participating beneficiary in the form of Fixed Deposit / NSC/ Call Deposit drawn in favour of self and pledged in favour of EE(Agri.) / AEE(Agri.) of the District along with a application (as security deposit). f) The premium deposited against cluster of STW shall be refunded to the beneficiaries after two years from the date of commissioning of cluster STW & Sub-station. g) The power drawn from the 25 KVA or 63 KVA sub-station by the cluster shall be utilised exclusively for agriculture purpose only. No diversion of power or use otherwise shall be permitted. Premium amount deposited by the participating beneficiaries in a cluster shall be forfeited in case of diversion of power by any of the beneficiaries of the cluster. h) For the provision of 25KVA and 63KVA sub-station, beneficiaries having 20 Ha and 60 Ha contiguous cultivable land respectively would submit applications in group for the respective provision with a cover letter in plain paper jointly signed by the applicants. i) In case of Solar Photovoltaic Water Pumping System consisting of Surface Pump (2HP), farmer's share i.e. 15% of cost of SPV Pumping system of Rs 1,87,489.00 amounting to Rs.28,123/- (including premium of Rs 10,000/- already deposited

along with the application) in the form of bank draft, drawn in favour of supplier, will be deposited to the District Engineer (as per Annexure-III). j) In case of Solar Photovoltaic Water Pumping System consisting of Submersible Pump (2HP), farmer's share (i.e. 15 % of cost of SPV Pumping system of Rs 2,09,449.00) amounting to Rs. 31,417/- (including premium of Rs 10,0000/

NGOs will work in close coordination with the office of the District Engineer. The District Engineer will monitor the activities of the NGOs under their respective districts and report to the Director of Agriculture, Assam and Chief Engineer, Agriculture, Assam.

ii) To help in disseminating project information amongst the Farmers/ Farmers Group in Kamrup rural & metro.

iii) To help in organizing district/block/village level awareness/training/orientation on various issues of the project including technical, environmental and social work inter dist.
