About The Program 'Savitrichi Shala'

The project aims to provide a safe and nurturing environment for children in the communities of Phule Nagar, Wadar Wasti and Ekata Nagar. community centers in each of these areas, the project address the lack of resources and opportunities for children's early childhood development. The community centers in Phule Nagar and Wadar wasti seen success in engaging children in recreational activities and promoting education and health awareness. centers have become an integral part of the community, providing a sense of belonging and support for families. This center serves as a resource for families, providing access to essential services and information.

Despite facing financial difficulties, Suraj's mother has prioritized his education, knowing that it is the key to a brighter future. With the help of Nirman's support classes and education scholarship, Suraj has been able to excel in his studies and even pursue his passion for football. The support class has not only helped him improve academically, but it has also given him a sense of belonging and the opportunity to be part of a football team. a sport he now enjoys playing and has gained recognition for at the school level. This has given him a sense of confidence and motivation, and he has even received an education scholarship of Rs. 4000 to further his studies.



Supplementing Educational Aspiration of girls from NT-DNT communities to pursue higher education in Pune District.





Goal

Increase educational attainment, career prospects and enhance skills of girls from NT-DNT communities in Pune district.

Objectives

1. To provide financial assistance to 100 girls who aspire to pursue higher education (Beyond 10th).
2. To promote equal opportunities and access to education for girls, regardless of their socio- economic background.
3. To encourage girls to pursue higher education and reach their full potential.

About The Program

The project aims to increase their educational attainment and career prospects and enhance the skills of 100 girls from Pune District. The project support completing their education beyond 10th. The project promotes girls' child education to reduce child marriage practices in the 10 villages of Indapur blocks and 3 slums in Pune City. Scholarship support is provided to girls from NT-DNTi communities. The project provided necessary resources such as textbooks, school supplies, to support the girls in their education. This also helped bridge the digital divide and equip the girls with the necessary technology skills.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Increased educational attainment: Scholarship programs helped 100 girls to overcome financial barriers and pursue higher education, resulting in increased graduation rates and educational attainment.
- Improved career prospects: Scholarship recipients often have access to resources, networking opportunities, and mentorship, which can enhance their career prospects and lead to better employment opportunities.
- Enhanced skills and knowledge: Scholarships enable students to access quality education and gain specialized skills and knowledge in their chosen fields, making them more competitive in the job market.
- Increased diversity and inclusion: Scholarship programs that target underrepresented groups help promote diversity and inclusion in higher education, creating more equitable opportunities for students from diverse backgrounds.



SUCCESS STORY

“Empowering Migrant Women: Assistance to Kalpana through PMMVY”

It was during this difficult time that Nirman and their MRC Project Team, came to Kalpana's aid. Nirman Team informed her about the MRC program and the Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana, a government scheme which provides financial assistance to pregnant and lactating mothers. Kalpana was hesitant at first, unsure of the process and the benefits she would receive. But with Nirman Team's guidance, she decided to register under the scheme.

Nirman Team helped Kalpana fill out the necessary forms and accompanied her to the Anganwadi Centre for registration. She also assisted in getting Kalpana her MCP card from the local ASHA/ANM. Through this process, Kalpana became aware of the importance of proper healthcare during her pregnancy and the need for regular check-ups. Within 30 days of registration, Kalpana received the first instalment of Rs. 1000 directly transferred to her bank account. This helped her cover some of the expenses and ease the financial burden she was facing. She received two more instalments of Rs. 2000 each, this financial assistance provided by the government helped Kalpana and her family during a time of crisis and ensured that she received proper care during her pregnancy. The team also provided support to Kalpana's family during their ration distribution drive in the village, showcasing their commitment to helping and uplifting migrant communities. Thanks to the support and assistance provided by Nirman and their Jansathi, Kalpana was able to access financial aid and support during a challenging time in her life. This case demonstrated the impact and importance of proactive action and support for migrant workers, especially during times of crisis.

About The Program

Nirman Sanstha has made significant efforts to empower and educate the marginalized communities by running Five Support schools in five NT_DNT communities. As part of its initiative to develop life skills and raise awareness about child rights, the organization formed the Five Balpanchayat Group with 110 members who are dedicated to protecting their own rights. The distribution of educational materials to 202 children in marginalized communities has also positively impacted, these efforts resulted in successful resolutions of problems related to water, internal road facilities, and streetlights. The organization's impact goes beyond infrastructure and education, as seen through the enrollment of 189 children in 5 Savitri School and the successful handling of 5 child sexual abuse cases. NIRMAN Sanstha has also built strong relationships with government agencies and collaborated with them to address issues related to children and women.

SUCCESS STORY

“Breaking the Chains of Discrimination: The Story of Savitrichi Shala and the Paradhi Community's Fight for Education”

Milind Ramesh Mettapalli, a Police Sub Inspector, was invited to Pardhi Wasti to open the first ever Support school in the village in his inauguration speech. He acknowledged how the NT/DNT communities have faced systemic stigmatization for decades, but the people of Vyahali village have chosen to focus on education. The Paradhi community settled in the village 35 years ago but were labelled as criminals under the Criminal Tribes Act of 1871. This led to social and economic marginalization and discrimination against them. Their migratory nature also makes it difficult for them to access government entitlements. This has affected their children's education, as they often must work as laborers to support their families. However, the people of Vyahali village decided to challenge this notion by setting up a Savitrichi Shala, with support from local community members and Nirman, an organization working with NT-DNT tribes in Maharashtra. Through training and workshops, they have capacitated the community to understand their rights and entitlements. As a result, the first support school in the village was built, providing education on child rights, child protection, and constitutional rights. The school also offers primary math, science, and sports education to 32 children. This effort is a testament to the community's collective consciousness and their determination to overcome discrimination and provide a better future for their children.

Today, Paradhi Community children, along with many others in the community, are attending school and learning skills that will help them lead a better life. The success of Savitrichi Shala has inspired other villages in the area to follow suit and open support schools for marginalized communities, creating a ripple effect of change and progress in the region.



Migrants Resilience Collaborative





Goal

Safe Migration of 3 lakh+ migrant workers (Construction Workers, Sugarcane Cutters, brick workers and Domestic Workers) by the end of 2027 in Maharashtra.

Objectives

1. Improving the social and health status of Migrant families through linkages to government welfare schemes and programs.
2. Engage with government to connect workers to all eligible social Protections to their families and themselves.
3. To ensure workers have supports to access their basic rights related to minimum wages, safe working and living condition.

About The Program

In India, millions of migrant workers face dire challenges as they move from rural areas to urban centers in search of livelihood opportunities. Many of them are often exploited and vulnerable, trapped in bonded labor, a modern-day form of slavery. They leave their homes, often with no choice, seeking better employment opportunities in urban areas. However, upon arrival, they frequently find themselves in precarious working conditions, subjected to low wages, exploitation, and even bonded labor.

Nirman currently works on social protection and safe migration and has effectively facilitated 10k+ people in accessing citizenship documents, BOCW (registration, card, health checkup and safety kits), social entitlements and other financial benefits. This project aims to address the critical issue of bonded labor's rescue and rehabilitation, migrant workers' social protection mechanisms and advocating for their rights.

SUCCESS STORY

"Rising from Adversity: A Case Study of Shubham's Journey as a Migrant Worker in Search of Sustainable Livelihood"

Shubham's life has been a constant struggle since he was a young boy. Born and raised in Village Barshi, district Solapur, Shubham faced many challenges due to the drought that hit his village. After completing his 12th grade, he pursued a course in ITI, but his family's savings were depleted due to the devastating effects of the drought. With limited employment opportunities in his village, Shubham and his brother were forced to work as farmers to make ends meet.

The situation in his village became increasingly dire, and soon, Shubham and his family had no choice but to migrate to the city in search of better job prospects. Shubham was only 24 years old at the time, but he felt the weight of responsibility on his shoulders, being the eldest son in a family of six. With his father being a diabetic patient, their financial situation became even more strained, and they were forced to take loans from lenders to survive. Unfortunately, they were unable to keep up with the interest payments, and Shubham's brother fell into addiction, leaving Shubham as the sole breadwinner for his family.

Life in the city was not as easy as they had hoped. Without any financial support, they struggled to find stable employment. They started working at Labor naka, and later, Shubham found a job as a wireman at a construction site in Wagholi. It was there that he first heard about the BOCW (Building and Other Construction Workers) card from a safety officer. He immediately registered for it, hoping to receive some benefits to support his family.



Nirman- Tech Mahindra Foundation Smart Vocational Training Center





About The Program

'NIRMAN in collaboration with Tech Mahindra Foundation started its 'Smart Vocational Training Centre' at Vishrantwadi and Kasarwadi.

SMART or Skills-for-Market Training is a model vocational training program for socio-economically disadvantaged youth in the age group of 18 to 30 and trains them in the trades of Basic IT, Yuva English, Workplace readiness, IT enable services/BPO, and Banking Financial Services & insurance to get a good job opportunity. The duration of the Smart course is 4 months. After successful completion of in-house training students are given on job training which is also part of Smart training followed by their certification and then placement. Follow-up of students is taken on a monthly basis. Tech Mahindra Foundation, PCMC Girls ITI and NIRMAN collaborated to deal with the situation and extend their hand to bring out Girls and women's from the situation to make them employable, confident and with positive outlook towards life. Tech Mahindra Foundation came up with SMART (Skills-for-Market Training) a model vocational training program for socio-economically disadvantaged youth, enabling them to actualize their potential in a career of their choice.

Goal

To enhance the employability of youth aged 18 to 30 years by providing four-month skill training and bridge the skill gap in the service sector in Pune city.

Objectives

- To impart training in spoken English, Basic IT with advanced Excel, soft skills, and the domain of ITES-Business Process Outsourcing (BPO) to the aspirant.
- To place (150)75% of students with good salaries in different companies

Achievements

- 100+ youths & women trained on business ideas & linkages later started small businesses.
- At the Kasarwadi Center, 200 individuals were trained, while at the Vishrantwadi Center, 220 individuals received training. Placement rates stand at 74% (162 placements) for Vishrantwadi and 69% (138 placements) for Kasarwadi.
- The average salary for placed candidates is ₹13,193 at Vishrantwadi and ₹11,490 at Kasarwadi. Additionally, 100+ companies have partnered with both centers to facilitate employment opportunities.



Nirman- Masoom's Evening Learning Centers



Goal

Facilitating adult education: The evening learning center aims to provide opportunities for adults to continue their education,

Objectives

1. To promote a positive and inclusive learning community.
2. To support students in achieving their academic goals.
3. To Help the Community Stakeholder complete the Minimum Secondary Level Education

About The Program

Nirman currently works with a total of 2-night schools in Pune, with the aim Complete the Secondary Level Education of the NT/DNT Youth. These schools are run by charitable trusts supported by Massom. Aim of the ELC is to provide accessible and quality education to individuals who are unable to attend traditional day schools due to various reasons such as financial constraints, family responsibilities, or work commitments. The ELC program is specifically designed to support the out of school students / dropouts to pass class 10 especially in the areas where there are no alternative models like night schools or other platforms. the Evening Learning Centre seeks to address the educational needs of the underserved population, especially women, children, and adults from low-income families. It also aims to promote equal opportunities and reduce educational disparities by providing education that is both affordable and flexible.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Total 50 Student Has Enrolled in ELC
- The impact of ELC (Evening Learning Centers) total of 50 students enrolled in the Batch, the program has shown a significant turnout, indicating its popularity and success.
- Out of the 50 students, 16 have passed with distinction
- 17 students have passed with first class, which is another commendable feat. These students have demonstrated a good grasp of the language and have shown a strong level of dedication and hard work
- The high passing percentage of 97.95% in Pune also speaks volumes about the success of the ELC. This shows a significant improvement in the students

“Empowering Women Through Education: A Case Study of Shradha's Journey to Success and Confidence”

Shradha, her husband, and their son live in Yerwada, Pune. Shradha dropped out of class IX due to a lack of interest in school and her family's financial troubles. She later married and gave birth to a son. As she saw her son study, she understood the value of a stable after 'securing a' in securing a good job. Her husband drives a vehicle, but all schools were closed due to the pandemic. His monthly income dropped from Rs 8000 to Rs 6000.

She has grown confident and positive because of the training she received for online programs, as well as the support she received. Shradha's ambition is to progress in the fields of photography, videography, and editing, and we wish her luck in all her endeavors.

Nirman Intervention:

Shradha's son read a WhatsApp message regarding ELC on her phone. He encouraged Shradha to enroll for her SSC. Shradha enrolled in a school after a gap of more than 20 years and began her 10th grade education at Masoom's Nirman Evening Learning Center in Pune. Shradha's willpower was strengthened, and she scored an incredible 82% in her SSC exams. Every teacher admires her for providing clear and concise responses as well as taking initiative and motivating other students in online session



Maitri Project





Goal

A network of Maitri Partners and Local CBOS/CSOs are working collectively towards prevention of violence against women and

OBJECTIVE

State systems are more responsive and operate more effectively to support survivors of sexual violence.

Social systems and communities are treating victims with dignity and are better able to respond and support victims to return to a post-trauma 'normal'.

Women and children from at-risk communities are aware, resilient and feel empowered to take a stand against violence.

About The Program:

The overarching aim of our project is to diminish the prevalence of sexual violence in Satara and Solapur districts in, Maharashtra. Our interventions concentrate on women and girls belonging to social groups facing the highest risk and in dire need of services, particularly those lacking access to socio-legal and psychological support. This includes survivors of rape and sexual abuse, trafficking survivors, Dalit and Indigenous women and girls, survivors of caste-based commercial sexual exploitation.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

NIRMAN provided COVID relief support to over 5,000 vulnerable individuals, including women, men, single women, and transgender individuals. The support included dry ration kits and school-related materials for children, ensuring essential aid during the crisis.

NIRMAN has established a strong rapport with government departments, particularly the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) and the District Women and Child Welfare Department in Solapur and Satara districts. Through this collaboration, NIRMAN has successfully conducted various programs aimed at supporting and empowering vulnerable communities.



GOAL

To enhance STEM education by training teachers in innovative methodologies, fostering curiosity-based learning, and strengthening school governance through active stakeholder engagement.

OBJECTIVES

Train teachers in STEM-based teaching methodologies to create interactive, curiosity-driven classroom environments that promote group learning and critical thinking.

Support teachers and students in developing innovative solutions to real-life problems by integrating digital technologies and hands-on learning approaches.

Engage students, parents, school committees, local governments, and community stakeholders to improve school governance, enrolment, retention, and overall learning outcomes.

About Program:

The Project Jigyasa is premised on the principles of sustainability, participation and democracy. Introduction of STEM methodology is value enrichment in the right to education discourse set in by the government through for example SSA, RMSA and the RTE, and its vision for educated India and democracy. The project builds capacity of teachers in order to elicit children's participation. Likewise, it engaged with both teachers and SMC/community to strengthen school governance and in planning STEM operations. Drivers of the initiative under this project are teachers, parents, SMC and students. The project engaged key educational stakeholders in developing a participatory, rational and scientifically-driven educational environment for the benefit of all students.

Achievements

- Teachers from 10 schools across one location have been successfully trained in STEM teaching methodology, enhancing their ability to deliver interactive and engaging lessons.
- Students from 10 schools are benefiting from innovative pedagogical practices, developing a scientific temperament and engaging in curiosity-driven learning.
- STEM teaching practices have been integrated into school curricula, with active support from school administrations and collaboration with Municipal/State Government bodies to ensure

Automotive Vocational Training Centre

Goal

To enhance employment opportunities for youth by providing industry-relevant training in Auto Component Assembly Fitter trades, along with IT skills, Spoken English, and Personality Development, through the Automotive Center of Excellence in partnership

Objectives

Equip youth with technical expertise in Auto Component Assembly Fitter trades, supplemented with basic IT, Spoken English, and Personality Development to improve employability.

Provide hands-on training and on-the-job experience to ensure students gain the practical skills required by the automotive industry.

Facilitate NSDC certification and support students in securing employment in the automotive sector, ensuring a smooth transition into the

About Program:

NIRMAN, with the support of the ADM Foundation, established the Automotive Center of Excellence in Chakan, Pune, to train youth in Auto Component Assembly Fitter trades. The three-month training program includes technical skills, IT proficiency, Spoken English, and Personality Development to enhance job readiness. After in-house training, participants receive on-the-job exposure, followed by NSDC certification and placement assistance to help them secure sustainable employment in the automotive sector.

Achievements

- A structured three-month training program has enabled youth to acquire technical and soft skills, followed by NSDC certification, ensuring their competency and credibility in the job market.
- 30 Graduates of the program have successfully secured placements in leading automotive companies, benefiting from improved career prospects and financial stability.

Women affected by COVID





About Program:

Nirman initiated a comprehensive data collection and outreach program to support women and children affected by COVID-19 in Pune and Satara districts of Maharashtra. Initially, the program aimed to survey 200 women and 150 children, but it successfully reached over 250 widowed women, whose husbands had succumbed to the virus. The program is designed to address critical challenges faced by these families, with a thematic focus on Community Development, Prevention of Gender-Based Violence, Access to Social Security Schemes Livelihood Support and education support:

Goal

To empower women and children affected by COVID-19 by ensuring livelihood opportunities, access to social security schemes, education, and community support, while preventing gender- based violence and fostering holistic development.

Objectives

Provide livelihood support through skill development, job placement, and entrepreneurship opportunities for women who have lost an earning member of their family. Facilitate access to social security schemes, legal aid, and gender-based violence prevention programs to create a safe and supportive environment for affected families. Ensure continued education and psychosocial support for children who have lost one

Achievements

275 women in all (148 from the Pune district and 127 from Satara) received citizenship credentials such as ration cards, bank accounts, residential certificates, and income certificates. 608 women applied for various government programs as a result of having access to these documents. 178 women out of the 608 women who applied for various government programs were successful in receiving benefits. As a result of ongoing interactions with the government, 273 single women received citizenship documents, and 178 women benefited from various government programs.



JEEVANDOOT





Goal

To build a network of trained first responders by equipping citizens with basic first aid skills, raising awareness about Good Samaritan laws, and fostering a culture of proactive emergency response in the PCMC area.

Objectives

Provide first aid training to roadside vendors, auto drivers, traffic police, PMPL guards, PMPL drivers, college youth, and NSS students to ensure they can respond effectively in emergencies.

Educate participants on the importance of golden hours in emergencies and legal protections available to Good Samaritans, encouraging more people to assist in crisis situations without fear.

Distribute first aid kits and collaborate with traffic departments and other stakeholders to ensure first aid accessibility at critical locations.

About Program:

Nirman, in collaboration with United Way Mumbai and Tech Mahindra, implements the Jeevan Doot program to create a network of first responders in the PCMC area. The initiative engages various stakeholders, including roadside vendors, auto drivers, traffic police, PMPL guards, PMPL drivers, college youth, and NSS students, to equip them with basic first aid skills and knowledge of Good Samaritan laws.

The program emphasizes the importance of the golden hour—the crucial period after an accident when timely medical intervention can save lives. Participants receive training on first aid techniques, including CPR, wound care, and emergency response protocols. Additionally, first aid kits are distributed to ensure accessibility during emergencies.

Achievements

- Successfully trained road users, including traffic police, on essential first responder skills, improving emergency response efficiency in the region.
- Partnered with 14 traffic divisions to provide first aid boot kits, significantly enhancing the readiness of traffic departments to handle road emergencies.

Covid – 19 Relief Support



The lockdown had a huge impact on people's lives especially the NT/DNT Community, daily wage labourers, migrants and other vulnerable communities. People lost their livelihoods impacting girls, boys and families. The pandemic forced people to migrate to native places and explore other alternatives to earn money. Education of children was affected as all educational institutions were closed as a precautionary measure.

Nirman undertook strategic and collaborative actions to bolster public health efforts to contain Covid-19 and minimize the disruptions and humanitarian fallout on poor people's livelihoods, education of children, safety and protection of girls and young women and the healthcare of persons with HIV and other chronic illnesses Covid 19 response Team promoted mass awareness on Covid-19 disease and its prevention strategies, strengthened the government's public health infrastructure and community support systems that enable poor families to access the government safety nets. It also supported vulnerable families with food kits to overcome under-nourishment in children, adolescents and pregnant/lactating mothers. Additionally, helped was also provided to Evening Learning Center with technical assistance to start home-based learning for children. Migrant families, daily wage earners and agricultural laborers were supported with alternate livelihood options and income generation schemes to prevent them from falling into destitution.
